MINUTES:

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 25th December, 1970, and the First Committee Meeting held on 25th December, 1970, were taken as read.

Moved for adoption by Mr. A.H. Chothia and seconded by Mr. A.C. Tilly.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

Mr. Bhabha pointed out that filling in of brief new Application Forms should not necessarily be of acceptance.

The Chairman requested that a brief renewal Form be filled in by applicants for renewals. Progress reports must be sent in by all students every six months.

A comprehensive report fully detailing grants was submitted. The matter of refusals and renewals was freely debated and finally the following resolution was passed:-

" Failing of a year of studies should not be a criteria for refusing Scholarships".

Mover - Dr. M.S. Dendar. Seconder - Mr. I. Patel.

Voting for 10 against 1.

The Scholarship Committee was requested to meet immediately after the meeting to review the grants and authorise the payments.

INDIA MATTERS:

Mr. E.A. Dadabhay gave a brief report on his observations during his 24 hours stay at Kholvad. The main points were:-

(a) The problem of pupils, particularly those attending Secondary School, is that they do not find enough time to attend Madressa. Gur Ustaads and India Committee members recommend that our school should not be handed over to the Government, as it will result in a complete lack of our control and Diniaat education will suffer.

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- (b) The position of the Diniaat Ustaeds is a grave one. We should increase wages and efficiency of teachers.
- (c) The water pipes after over 40 years of services, is now in a very bad state, and will soon have to be replaced at heavy costs.
- (d) Kholvad is now populated with people from other towns and there are hardly 125 houses of member families, which will reduce day by day.
- (e) The village is very untidy and cannot be a source of pride.
- (f) Musjieds have a negligible number of regular Musalis.

After discussions on the report it was unanimously agreed that the India Committee be informed that this Committee will have no objection to increase efficiency in Madressas and increase in costs will be gladly borne by us.

Report from India Committee as presented by Mr. G.H. Bhabha:-

MADRESSA:

There are 4 teachers and 180 pupils (89 Boys & 91 Girls). The pariod of tuition is $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours daily and approximate yearly costs are Rs.6000.

SCHOOLS:

There are 569 students as detailed under:-

	BOYS.	GIRLS.
Muslims	127	105
Non-Muslims	201	126

The total expense to run a primary section is approximately Rs.23000 yearly and we get a grant of 10,000 rupees from the Education Department.

SETTLEMENT OF YOUTH IN CANADA:

Fourteen youth have already left Kholvad and four to five are waiting to leave soon. Difficulty is being experienced for deposits required by the immigration. It was decided that a float of \$3,000 to \$4,000 be placed at the disposal of responsible members in Canada, and to place deposits where necessary and collect some loan on our behalf. This fund should be arranged from Kholvad Social Welfare Committee Funds.

Mr. G.H. Bhabha was requested to get further details from Mr. G.H.S. Pahad on his offer to Mr. E.A. Dadabhay to assist in getting a passage at lower fares from India to Canada.

LETTER OF GORAMOTA VANIA:

re: Dispute with Committee. Complained that he was appointed Head of Madressa, by Mr. A.C. Tilly. House agreed that a photostat be sent to our Committee with instructions that matter be investigated and report back to us.

Secretary reported that Hajes Suleiman Dadabhay graciously wished to donate his portion of the proceeds of sale of land to our Madressa, as well as certain shares of his stands. Accepted with thanks. Letter of thanks to be sent to Mr. Dadabhay.

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House appointed A.A. Cajee and A.C. Tilly to approach Mr. Ebrahim Dadabhay and officials to donate and acquire balance of his share to Madressa. The only condition is that the Madressa has to pay legal expenses. Dr. S.Y. Dendar moved we accept this offer, seconded by Mr. Saleem Dadhi. House agreed in principle to send an envoy to have the property registered and sold at best advantage, cost of travel etc. not to exceed R2,000.00. Members were told to contact other owners of houses to donate their buildings to the Madressa.

TOWER MUSJIED:

Bhay Pelwan busy preparing accounts of various Masjieds, separating funds of the three mosques and invest to the best of advantage.

GENERAL:

- (a) Mr. Ebrahim Dadabhay suggested that Minutes of all the Meetings be sent to our office in Kholvad.
- (b) Mr. Ebrahim Dadabhay also suggested that a book of resolutions be kept and all records be incorporated therein.

RENT INCREASES:

Chairman reported that tenants have been approached and details will be given at the next meeting.

INVESTMENTS:

Mr. A.H. Kaka stated that an agent has sublot 103 of lot 4, size 10,500 sq. feet and is a three storied building in the course of erection. Three tenants could be made available @ R500.00 each, and the property is offered at R175,000. Bond available of R120,000, payable over 3 years. The property is in Archery Road, Clairwood, Durban. Mr. Paruk will come to see us on 23/3/71 and officials will meet to discuss this investment.

BRAZIL:

Mr. Ebrahim Dadabhay reported that a possibility exist, whereby Brazil would welcome agriculturists from foreign countries and required the blessings of the house to explore this field for the community's welfare. An amount of R250.00 earmarked for expenses. It was also agreed to co-ordinate the other towns for this purpose.

AUDITORS REPORT:

Not submitted yet because the books are in the hands of the auditors.

# **INVESTMENTS:**

Mr. G.H. Bhabha reported that a property situated at MBABANE consisting of shops and offices is available and gross return will be in the neighbourhood of 14%, which in his opinion would be a suitable investment, against low yields in the Republic.

Mr. A.H. Jassat drew attention of the Committee to the move amongst Market Street Property Holders to try and get alternate investing opportunities, when the present properties are sold. He reported that he is preparing a Memorandum for the Madrassa's benefit.

PAGE 2/....

Dr. M.S. Dendar expressed an opinion that property participation in Joint Ventures with reputable property developers would be better for the Madrassa, or alternately debentures with good yields should be considered.

Mr. E.A. Dadabhay felt that industrial land in Lenasia should be investigated.

Mr. M.O. Moolla felt that flat rights stand for sale by C.I.T. should be investigated. Mr. I.S. Moollabhay expressed an opinion that the money should be kept on hand and not rushed into investments, until suitable investments with good returns is found.

Mr. A.H. Kaka advised that we should find ready built properties as the developing of vacant sites might result in disappointments.

Mr. Y. Wadee felt that property investment in Grey Street Complex should be investigated.

Dr. S.Y. Dindar informed the house that Amalgamated Enterprises has purchased a stand in Pietermaritzburg, measuring 21,000 sq. feet at a cost of R210,000 and they may consider participation in development thereof. The project is expected to yield 10% nett. when completed. He would, if the Committee wishes get details and place same for our consideration at the next meeting.

Mr. E.A. Saloojee opposed the idea of going into partnership and recommended investing on our own. Mr. M.S. Tilly supported him.

Finally after lengthy discussions the following two resolutions were moved:-

"That this Board of Management must not undertake an investment in partnership with others." Mover - Mr. G.H. Bhabha. Seconder - Mr. S. Tilly.

"That this Committee investigates all avenues of investments either individually or in partnership with other individuals or organisations.

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# **AUDITOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. A.H. Chothia presented the report and replied to all enquiries pertaining thereto. He drew attention of the Board to the fact that the rate of not drawing more than R10.00 in cash from Petty Cash at a time has bot been strictly adhered to, and further recommended that Arch lever files be used in place of existing files.

# **DISCUSSIONS:**

The Board unanimously agreed to raise the Petty Cash draw  $\sim$  1 limit from R10.00 to R60.00

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Mr. A.H. Chothia questioned the principle of charges to Hadjees put up at the club for U.T.A. from the 27th to 30th, December, 1970; and informed the house that we hold on hand a cheque for R152.00 from the Hadj Travels Services though according to his investigations a sum of R210.00 as willed by the Madrassa had been approved by U.T.A.

The Secretary explained that we would not have charged the individuals but as this was charges against Airways, we feel that no principle is at stake. Previously when Hotel facilities were not available Airways had been charged for accommodations. He further promised that the matter of difference in amount collected and cheque on hand will be investigated and steps to recover amount due to us will be taken.

Mr. M.A. Denath's Telegram read he was not in favour of investments in Swaziland. Wait for local opportunities.

Mr. A.H. Chothia's letter favouring the investment in Swaziland and wishing success into the venture was read.

#### SWAZILAND PROPERTY - MBABNE - EMPIRE BUILDING:

The Chairman, Mr. A.H.M. Jassat explained to the house the purpose of this emergency meeting and informed that a property, situated in Allistar Miller Street, MBABANE, known as EMPIRE BUILDING, built on a  $50 \times 100$  stand and consisting of 2 shops, an office on ground floor, offices on second floor and flats on third floor, yielding gross income of R13,500.00 yearly and a nett income before taxation of approximately R11,000.00; is available at a price of R110,000.00

### DISCUSSIONS:

Mr. Y. Wadee mentioned that he was informed by a Mr. Mahomed of Durban that a factory in Sea Cow Lake built at 3 floor levels yielding R750.00 per month gross, with room for improvements at a price of R100,000 is available and rather than investing in Swaziland we should investigate this investment.

As it appeared from discussions that some members are against investing in Swaziland, the Chairman requested that the Committee should resolve whether to entertain investments in Swaziland at all or not, before discussing to purchase the property under consideration. The matter was fully debated and finally the following resolutions were moved. That this house invests in properties in Swaziland.

Mover - Dr. S.Y. Dindar. Seconder - Mr. I. Patel.

# AMENDMENT:

"That this house should not entertain further investments in Swaziland".

Mover - Mr. Y. Wadee. Seconder - Mr. M.S. Tilly.

Voting for resolution - 12 Voting for Amendments - 5 Voting for Abstention - 1

The matter of property on offer was placed for discussion.

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Doctor S.Y. Dindar informed the house that this was a premier site and strongly recommends that this property be purchased. He also felt that he has a good friend at MBABANE who could clinch the deal for us at a price cheaper than R110,000.00 and he was requested to book a call and get full information. Whilst discussions were taking place a call was booked and final informations were that the property can be purchased for R109,000 through Mr. Taylor and gross rentals are as follows:-

- 1 Chemist shop let at R260.00 per month leased till 31/5/74.
- 1 Men's shop let at R160.00 per month leased till 31/5/74.
- 2 Suite of offices let at R380 per month, monthly tenancy. Doctors Consulting Rooms let at R120 per month, monthly tenancy.
- 4 Bachelor Flats let at R200 per month, monthly tenancy.

TOTAL GROSS RENTALS R1,120.00 PER MONTH.

Mr. A.S. Dangor informed the Board that the Chairman, Mr. A.H.M. Jassat has already made an offer for the property in his personal capacity which is not binding to the Madrassa in any way and further informed the Board that the reason for making the offer was the fact that according to informations other parties are also interested to purchase same if we find it unsuitable.

Messrs. Y. Wadee and M.S. Tilly once again requested the members to consider their decisions very carefully before voting and felt that we should not invest in Swaziland.

Dr. M.S. Dendar expressed the opinion that because Swaziland is a risk investment, we should have at least 4% above average return and this property does not yield that, therefore we should not purchase it. He felt that we can get far better investments in Joint Property Development and he would be in a position in the very near future to place for the consideration of the Board a scheme of participation in property developments with security yielding an income more attractive than the one offerred by the Empire Building.

Finally the following resolutions were moved:-

"That this Board of Management authorises purchase of Empire Building and empowers the officials to conclude the deal for a price not exceeding R109,000."

Hajee E.A. Dadabhay presented a report on his observations whilst he was at Kholvad, and advised the members not to pass the control of the schools to the Government. This was necessary to regularise and suitable to us, the timetable to fit in diniaat classes on the South African scene, he urged the incoming Board of Management to encourage technical education.

Mr. Cajeebhay from Reunion informed the house that he was disappointed to see the condition of our buildings in India. The Madressa is untidy, the school building is leaking and needs repairs and paint. He also informed the members that on the plaque at the Madressa Building the name of Chothia family is mentioned as donors, and the name of the Mogalia family is left out. This should be rectified.

Mr. M. Ader of Reunion also took the call of the Chairman and informed the members that he always reads our reports with interest, and is very much impressed with our progress. He endorsed the recommendation of Mr. E.A. Dadabhay to pay greater attention to technical education.

Mr. G.H. Bhabha, reported on the progress made in settling youths from Kholvad in Canada and recommended that they should be aided to open up businesses.

MATTERS ARISING: MANZINI PROPERTY; The Chairman advised house that the Madressa had not been advised of any increase in rates.

RENT BOARD HEARING: The Secretary reported that the hearing of the Rent board took place on the 31st. October, and postponed to 8th. November and 14th. November 1972. The application was opposed by Messrs. G. Saloojee, G. H. Saley, I. Pahad, G. Cajee, Ameen Cajee, I. M. Cassoo and Gokal. As the case was still sub-judice, no other comments could be made at this stage. The House condemned very strongly the action of members of our own community in their participation and staging an opposition, since six of them were Kholvadians. Mr. A. S. Dangor complimented the secretary for his un-tiring efforts and sincertity, even at the risk of losing goodwill, but not deviating from loyalty to the Madressa. Mr. Dangor condemned the untruths advanced by the opposition, but yielded to the fact that tenants had a ligibinate right which were not denied. The House expressed its confidence in the secretary and empowered him to act in all Rent matters that may come up before the Rent Board.

Mr. E. I. Wadwalla moved that unless Mr. Ameen Cajee pays all arrear rentaks, immediately, legal action mest be instituted against him.

# THE HOUSE RESOLVED

This Board meeting resolved that all and every action be taken, including the institution of legal action in the appropriate and relevant Court of Law with jurisdiction to exercise its rights in terms of and arising out of an agreement against any of its tenants who have violated or breached

..../2 any of

any of its terms, conditions or provisions of such agreement arising between the Madressa and such tenant. The terms and provisions of this resolution shall also extend to the institution of such actions including legal actions against any of its tenant who has acted contrary to or has violated or breached any of his/her duties and/or obligations as a statuatory tenant under the Rent Act.

The Board further empowers and authorises and vests authority in any of its officials and more specifically in its Chairman and secretaries to do and perform all necessary and relevant acts including the sgining of any documents instructing legal representatives and empowering such representatives with the necessary mandate to give effect to and achieve the aims and objects of this resolution. "

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

That the caretaker should not be allowed to grant access to any files and other Madressa documents to anyone without prior premission of the officials. "

Moved by Mr. E. I. Wadwalla. Seconded by Mr. E. A. Dadabhay.

MINT ROAD DEVELOPMENT: A written report by the Committee was tabled recommending that the scheme be delayed for another year and seeking permission to draw sketch plans. The investment committee was authorised to spend funds on preparation of plans. Ør. M. S. Dendar agreed with the report tabled.

CANADIAN MIGRATION: Mr. A. E. Khota had just returned from a trip to Kholvad where he screened the application received from prospective emigrants. In all, over one hundred applications had been received. Only relatives of settlers in Canada could sponsor new applications under new immigration laws of Canada. Mr. Khota recommended that Mr. Moosa Vepari, Ebrahim Vania and others already in Camada be given financial assistance to enable them to remain. Mr. Abbas Nanabhay sought information regarding 35 applications worthy of consideration and on what grounds these were considered. Mr. A. S. Dangor replied that it was absolutely necessary to send Mr. Khota to Khokvad to gather vital information before new draft law was promulgated, information which could not be obtained by post. Mr. Dangor undertook to prepare an account of amounts collected, expenses paid out, etc. which would be tabled at the Annual General meeting. A general discussion dom took place on what to do with the amounty collected and since the cause for which the amount had been collected could not be fulfilled in the foreseeable future, the Committee is morally bound to refund the amount collected. Mr. A. S. Dangor suggested that the Madressa pay the cost of Khota's passage to Kholvad. IT WAS RESOLVED

"That the cost of Mr. A. E. Khota's airfares and all other incidental expenses be paid and borne out of Madressa's funds and that Canadian Committee refund all funds collected so far".

Passed unanimously., with exception of Mr. Abbas Nanabhay, who dis-sented to refunding of monies to donors but agreed to expenses being paid by the Madressa.

At this stage, the House adjourned for lunch from 1-10 p.m. until 2-15 p.m.

DR. KOTWAL PRIZE: The Scholarship committee would advertise the award and will decide on the prize after the application were received.

SCHOLARSHIP LOAN ACCOUNT: Members were once again reminded to try and influence their associates to pay up outstanding loan accounts. The secretary was instructed to send Molvie Behra his account. Mr. Abbas Nanabhay was requested to assist Mr. A. C. Tilly in drafting and despatching letters of demand requesting payment.

Mr. A. M. Jassat suggested that all resolutions be written by the mover.

AUDITOR'S REPORT : Mr. A. M. Jassat presented the report for year ending 30th. September 1972. It was agreed that

R54.30 in Meifil Seifil be transferred to Kinara Masjid account.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha was authorised to pay three months's allowance to Khota boys in Canada.





Mr. A. K. Dinat, a member of the Lenasia Muslim Association, thanked the Madressa for its past donations and appealed to the House that the need for more Madressas existed in Lenasia and we should come to its aid.

# (e). FINANCIAL STATEMENT :

Mr. A. M. Jassat presented the financial report which included the Balance Sheets and Revenue and Expenditure Accounts for year ended 30th. September 1972.

From the Income of K. G. Holding, it was observed that our nett income was R12,557 on an investment of R112,000, which yields a return of 10% on the investment.

The financial statement was accepted on a motion moved by M. A. Behra, seconded by M. O. Moolla.

#### (f). GENERAL

#### KHOLVAD MATTERS :

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay explained that our pleas and requests for audited accounts from Kholvad had been ignored for the past five years and the time has now come to take sterner measures to compel the authorities in Kholvad to yield. Owing to the mass exodus of younger members of the Kholvad sector, only about 60 now remain in Kholvad and the time will soon come when we will be swamped by outsiders. Owners of houses in Kholvad would be well advised to dispose of their assets before it is too late. Some houses were let to diamond polishers and if timely action is not taken, the tenants will become owners of these houses.

A recent Revenue and Expenditure accouns from Kholvad indicates that against an income of Rs. 48,420/- made up of Grants of Rs. 36,850/- and Fees of Rs. 11,570/-, there is an expenditure of Rs. 47,093/-. In the primary school, we are getting Rs. 900/- for 500 students, and the expenditure is Rs. 22,000. The incoming Board will have to consider this responsibility of the Government of India.

# K. E. S. C. D. R. :

The gri contract terminated on 16/12/72 and to negotiate compensation, we have to establish a Co-operative Committee in Kholvad.

#### MUSJIDS :

The musjids are getting empty and no-one is interested in their welfare We dread to think of the day when the Gujarat Government takes control of our Mosques and whem they will force their will upon us.

# TECHNICAL TRAINING :

Mr. Dadabhay appealed to the youth to obtain senior technical training and to go out into other industrial fields. In the High school in Kholvad, there were 124 boys and 29 girls. In the primary school, there were 339 boys and 205 girls, and in the Dinyat classes, there were 142 boys and 98 girls.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT the new officials are hereby empowered to operate a Banking Account in the name of the Madressa Anjuman Islamia of Kholvad and to sign all cheques, bills af exchange and other negotiable documents". Moved by Mr. Y. A. Wadee, seconded by Mr. A. S. Dangor.

Mr. Saleem Dadhiseth, in a moving speech, expressed his gratitude to those wellwishers who assisted in financial help for Kholvad Youth settlement in Canada and announced a scheme to collect cent—a—day payable by each Kholvadian., to assist needy Kholvadian shopkeepers.

Mr. A. S. Dangor felt that it was necessary for the Madressa to send a competent official to Kholvad to obtain firsthand information on our activities there. He felt that there was no close liason between the elected Committee in Kholvad and our Committee here. The officials in Kholvad were hopelessly disunited and a bridge must be created between the Committee in Kholvad and us here.

At this stage, tea and refreshments were served at 7-15 p.m. and the House agreed to send an enviry to Kholvad with specific instructions. Moved by Mr. Saleem Dadhi, and seconded by M. O. Moolla.

Mr. M. O. Moolla, moved that

"In keeping with present-day thoughts and circumstances, it was deemed expedient that the Annual General Meetings of the Madressa be held on the second Sunday in February in future".

Seconded by Mr. A. M, Jassat. Passed unanimously.

#### TERMINATION:

Mr. E. I. Wadwalla passed a vote of thanks to the past officials for the services rendered by them during the year and offered the hope and prayer that they will continue to take interest in the Madressa in the future. Mr. Areff seconded the motion and expressed his gratitude to all the members of the Board of Management.

The Chairman, Mr. A. H. Kaka, thanked all the members present and terminated the meeting with the wish that members will show keener interest in our Institution in the future.

MINUTES OF THE KHOLVAD AFFAIRS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD AT THE BOARD ROOM KHOLVAD HOUSE ON THE 10th. FEBRUARY 1973:

Mr, Bhabha in outlining the purpose of calling the meeting, informed the house that according to a report received from the WATER WORKS committee in Kholvad, that water crisis has developed following the take over of Keskor by the Gujrat Electricity board. The take-over of Keskor which, so far supplied power, free of charge to water work means now that water works has to buy power from the board at monthly cost of approxmately Rupees 1,200)

The water works stated in its report that in order to overcome this huge monthly expenditure, it decided to take the following action as from 17th December 1972.

(1) To restrict water supply to 3 hours a day from 7.30 p.m. to 19 p.m.
(2) To impose a water tax of Rupees 2, per household in order to minimise serious drain on its funds.

This action on the part of Kholvad water works committee, brought about considerable agitation from the public; which culminated in the formation of a committee, called, the Kholvad town committee comprising of all the castes, creed of Kholvad. In a memorandum submitted to the head office, dated 23rd January 1973. The committee sets out the villagers dissatisfaction at the curtailment of water supply and the imposition of the water tax withou reprentation.

The memorandum further asserts that the action of Kholvad water works committee, according to its constitution as a public trust, is unconstitutional, and goes on to advocate the calling of a mass meeting of all the residents of Kholvad, where free elections would be held to elect a water works committee, reprentative of all the residents. Mr. G.H.Pahad intervened between the two parties. And the outcome of his efforts, was that both parties agreed to write to head office, presenting their respective cases. And that pending replies from head office, the supply of free water be resumed forthwith.

A letter received from Mr. G.H.Pahad in which he suggested.

- (A) That the head office authorize the water works committee to continue supplying free water.
- (b) That initially it will cost R100 per month, butthe cost will be reduced to 50 Rand per month, after 6 months (No reason for expected reduction advanced)
- (*) Should the head office disagree with the above suggestion, than the Kholvad water works be handed over to the Gujrat Government
- (d) And finally offered his full cooperation in negotiating the sale and compensation of our invesment in the water works, should the Madressa decide to dispose off the water works to the Government.

CONT.,..../2.

In discussing the matter Mr. Y. Wadee stated that this was no longer a community question but a family matter and suggested that the head office agree to hand over the water works to the Government, and to subsidise, those families who find it difficult to pay water tax. Dr. M.S. Dendar also agreed that the water works be handed over to the Government.

Mr. G.H.Bhabha stressed that his late father and many other donors who donated land, money, shares ETC. to establish the water works for the Isale-Sawaab and of their families. It now appears that we are prepared to lose sight of their original intentions, discontinuing the "" supply of free water to the villagers. Mr, Bhabha maintaind that it was a matter of honouring the trust placed in the Madressa, by the donors to ensure that the water works continue supplying free water.

Mr. E.A. Dadabhay disagreed with Mr. Bhabha, and said the imposition of the water tax is not a breach of faith with the donors, the eriginal intention of supplying water to householders in Kholvad is carried out, and the tax of Rupees 2 is levied only to cover cost of Electricity in order to provide the required pressure.

Mr. Moollabhay and others took part in the discussion, which finally resulted in the following decision.

- (a) Water works committee be advised to continue supplying free water and to utilise its funds for the purpose, until further notice.
- (b) That the committee to supply water throughout the day, but should that not be possible, to revise the hours to suit the majority of residents.
- (e) Te advise Mr. Pahad of the committee's reply to the Kholvad water works committee.
- (d) Write to the Kholvad town committee that their representation will be submitted to the board of management at its meeting later this month, and the decision of the board will be a conveyed to them in due course.
- (e) To submit this matter to the board of management for final decision.

#### MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING DATED 24th. DEC. 1972

CORRECTIONS

D. Dindar to read H. Dindar.

Mr. A. S. Dangor moved acceptance of the minutes to be taken as read, seconded by Mr. A. H. Kaka. Accepted unanimously.

#### MATTERS ARISING :

RENT BOARD HEARING: The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia, reported that rentals of flats in Kholvad House were increased by approximately 25% and the total increase sanctioned by the Rent Board was R235 per month retrospective to 1st. October 1972.

AMEEN CAJEE : The secretary reported that legal action has been instituted against this defaulting tenant for recovery of arrear rentals and ejectment.

DR. KOTWAL PRIZE : Circulars were despatched to various centres by the Scholarship Committee in preferance to an advertisement in the daily newspapers due to costs involved. Mr. Abbas Nanabhay queried that students outside our immediate circle would not become aware of the requirements and steps be taken to make contact with them.

MANZINI PROPERTY: Mr. Y. A. Wadee reported that senior counsel had given an opinion which was quite favourable to us and which described Diamond's case "as an uphill task". Counsel for Diamond now maintained that the option was exercised in January 1972 and NOT in June 1972, as originally alleged. A reply from the postmaster was awaited. The House decided to leave this matter in the hands of Mr. Wadee, to be ibstructed by A. H. Chothia.

The Minutes were adopted on motion of Dr. H. Dindar, seconded by Mr. A. C. Tilly.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT: A written report was tabled by this Committee and read by Mr. Y. Wadee. The total amount granted for renewals for the year 1973 was R6,300 and new applications to R9,800 The correct name appearing as No. 6 should read Ebrahim Suliman Nanabhay. The report was accepted unanimously.

Dr. M. S. Dendar suggested that grants should be increased to include fees, board and lodging etc. The Treasurer replied that the machinery for repayments should first be created before the House considered increasing grants. A general discussion followed and members felt that stricter conditions for repayment be imposed. Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that all applications had been approved, but a lack of interest on part of recepients was apparent. The report was adopted on motion of Mr. Y. Bhabha, seconded by Bhai Patel. New application forms would be prepared before the next Annual General Meeting.

#### SWAZILAND PROPERTY: K. G. HOLDINGS.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that he was in M'babane and both the properties have been registered with the Swaziland Land Board. Dr. S. Dindar queried why no increase in rentals had been exercised in June 1972, as tenants were liable to pay pro rata increase of assessment rates. Dr. A. S. Dangor replied that vouchers and books were with auditors and it could not be determined whether an increase in rates had been effected. The officials were instructed to go into this matter and if an increase had been paid, then an increase in rates should be enforced.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT the Executive Committee investigate whether rates and taxes levied in respect of property in M'babane had been increased since purchase of property and this be so, then the rentals of the respective tenants be increased proportionately, where this was legally permissible. The Executive Committee is to have this matter finalised before the next mee - ting and to table a report. "

Maved by Dr. S. Dindar, seconded by Hamid Dangor.

Similar action is to be taken with regard to the Manzini property.

#### REPORT OF INFORMAL DISCUSSIONS OF CERTAIN OFFICIALS IN MEENA,

A report of informal discussions held in Meena, district of Mecca on the 15th. January 1973 was tabled at the meeting. Objections were raised regarding the heading of the report which was tabled. The House felt that the meeting was not an official meeting and the proceedings of the historical Meena meeting be given an un-official status. Mr. S. Tilly moved that the report be discarded, seconded by G. H. Bhabha and H. Dindar. On a majority vote of twelve (12) against ten (10), the meeting decided to scrap the entire report.

#### MINUTES OF KHOLVAD AFFAIRS COMMITTEE :

A report of proceedings dated 10 February 1973 was tabled. Mr. Hamed Dangor asked who comprised Kholvad Affairs Committee and why he was not informed about the meeting. Mr. G. H. Bhabha replied that a phone message was left. It was decided that members of Kholvad Affairs Committee should be separated from those who had attended in an advisory capacity. It was also ordered that A. H. Chothia attended in his official ex officio capacity and Y. E. Bhabha attended in an advisory capacity.

A report prepared by Mr. M. O. Moolla was read by him and the matter was opened for discussion.

#### Mr. Moolla's observations were

- a). Mr. Bhuskhav was quite co-operative and willing to resign, but local committee was not keen on his withdrawal.
- b). Dinyaat Madressa House resolved that extra two toilets and six urinals be erected at cost of Rs. 10,000. Mr. A. S. Dangor suggested that Suliman Dadabhay be approached and A. E. Khota, A. H. Chothia and G. H. Bhabha be instructed to interview Mr. Dadabhay.
- c). System of examining Madressa pupils be revised and principals be instructed to take examinations.
- d). Services of two additional Ustaads be engaged and salary be increased to a minimum wage of Rs. 175 to Rs. 250 p.m. with annual increment of Rs. 50 p.a. An increase of Rs. 50 take immediate effect.
- e). High School building in delapidated condition and requiring a coat of paint. House decided to delay painting until sufficient funds become available to committee from sale of KESCOR assets.
- f). Primary School.

## IT WAS RESOLVED

" THAT negotiations be commenced forthwith for handing over Primary School at Kholvad to Gujrat Government at nominal rental and a progress report be tabled at next meeting".

Moved by Abbas Nanabhay, seconded by E. I. Wadvalla.

Services of Mr. G. H. Pahad could be co-opted in Kholvad Marressa Committee and Water Warks and Kescor. Kholvad committee to be advise accordingly. Moved by Mr. A. S. Dangor, seconded by Saleem Tilly. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay suggested that negotiations with Gujrat Government be carried our peacefully and with understanding.

#### KINARA MUSJID

The affairs of Kinara Musjid were conducted by Mr. E. Bhabha, who has invested donations received in certain shares. House resolved that Kholvad Affairs Committee and Investment Committee meet to decide on probable investments.

#### **ELECTRICITY SUPPLY CORPORATION**

An inventory of assets was taken and proceeds of sale were expected scon. The House resolved that funds received from sale of Grid Power assets etc. should be supervised by Madressa from our local office.

#### WATER WORKS

According to a Trust established in Kholvad in 1952, water was to be suplied free of charge. The Kholvad Committee has new decided to hand over control of Water supply to Government and impose a levy of Rs2.00 per how usehold. A letter from NAAGRIG COMMITTEE dated 23rd. January 1973 was read. The subject matter was that no water was to be supplied free but a leve of Rs2.00 be imposed. A from of local representation by all section of public was also srught. Mr. G. H. Bhabha stated that providing water free of charge had always been the aim of the Madressa and a general discussion followed. Three issues were at stake

- 1. Should the waterworks be handed over to Government?
- 2. Was this House competent to give its decision?
- 3. Should water be continued to be supplied free in Kholvad?

Mr. A. S. Dangor suggested that a public meeting of interested parties be called specifically to decide this issue. Mr. Abbas Nanabhay felt that the House should not take any decisions on this major issue which should be decided by the public.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT a Special meeting be canvened on the the 13th. May 1973 at Nana Memorial Hall to decide the question of handing over Water Works to local Government".

Moved by Abbas Nanabhay, seconded by A. S. Dangor.

In the meantime, the officials were instructed to test the reaction of our office at Kholvad and obtain their feelings and consequences of handing over of control of Water Works and their comments.

#### ZAKAAT FUND AT KHOLVAD

Mr. Saleem Tilly suggested that this matter be left in abeyance until the next meeting when he will report back.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS IN KHOLVAD

Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that Amina Parak did not qualify for a grant from our Madressa and Mr. A. H. Chothia provided the sum of Rs.1000/— for her education. She now requires Rs.1700/— as against her original application of Rs900/—. Mr. Mnolla has now reported that she is getting grants from other sources as well.

At this stage, Mr. A. S. Dangor moved the appreciation of the House to those members who had met in Meena and as a result of their deliberations, quite a lot of first—hand reports had been received from Kholvad.

The House thanked Mr. Moolla for his reports and efforts made during is recent visit to Kholvad. Mr. A. M. Jassat and E. A. Dadabhay endorsed the same sentiments and expressed their appreciation.

Mr. H. Dindar enquired about any progress being made regarding prospects of investing Madressa's surplus funds. He also enquired about the development of Mint Road property. The house felt that positive steps be taken to invest the funds but Mr. E. A. Dadabhay cautioned the house into taking heaty steps before Fordsburg complex was ready for development.

Mr. A. S. Dangor suggested that wide powers be given to Investment Committee who were authorised to bond the Swaziland holdings to raise sufficent fleads for acquiring new properties. A new investment committee comprising of A. M. Jassat (convenor), A. H. Chothia, E. A. Saloojee, A. S. Dangor and G. H. Bhabha was appointed with full powers of investments.

The Chairman, Mr. M. O. Mooila explained that he had called the meeting in consultation with Mr. E. A. Dadabhay to clear a confusion that arose out of our donation to TEACH fund and a subsequent publication of the donation in the "STAR".

As he was a party to the whole issue, he recused himself and the Chair was taken by Mr. Y. A. Wadee, the Vice-Chairman.

Mr. Abbas Nanabhay arose and questioned the validity of the meeting — it being called by giving only about 48 hours's notice. He was supported in his contention by A. H. Chothia, who stated that the constitution did not make provision for a meeting to be called by the Chairman without consultation with thw two secretaries. Mr. G. H. Bhabha maintained that although he was told about a meeting, he did not consent to one being called at such short notice.

Mr. M. O. Moolla said Mr. Y. A. Wadee was not consulted and his prior approval was not obtained. Mr. Moolla said that a decision to donate R1500 to TEACH was taken at our A. G. Meeting and the officials decided that the donation would take place on the 9th. March. The Madressa had no connection with Mr. Latha or any other reporter from Star Line. A Mr. van Zyl of TEACH fund was not available and Mr. Baccalor was present. A Mr. Dwyer had said to him that the article would be published in the Star line as well. Mr. Abbas Nanabhay emphasized that the first paragraph was not Mr. Chothia's version, as the original statement given by Mr. Chothia could not be traced in the offices of the Star.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee stated that the meeting was not necessary and should not have been called.

Mr. M. O. Moolla alleged that Mr. Chothia published the said article.

Mr. A. H. Chothia stated that the article as published in the Star-was not the correct version and in support of his claim read a letter of apology from the Editor of the Star. He also read a corrected version from the copy of the Star of the same date, but which appeared in another part of the newspaper. He accused Mr. Moolla of making political capital out of this issue to gain a commercial advantage over him.

Mr. E. A. Saloojee asked what steps were taken by the Chairman to correct the situation. Mr. Moolla replied that certain members came to him and asked for a meeting. No Board of management members made such an approach and he refused to name the members who had asked for the meeting.

Mr. A. E. Khota wanted to know why Mr. Chothia instructed him not to contact the Star and informed him that Mr. Latha would come.

Mr. Chothia explained that Mr. Latha came of his own accord and brought along a photographer. He further explained that the widest publicity was given to the Chairman, who was seen handing the cheque to the reporter

Mr. Chothia wanted to know why Mr. Moolla had not taken exception when the cheque was being handed.

After expressing his bitter disappointment at the attitude of the Chairman, he tendered his resignation and left his seat.

There was an immediate uproar in the House and Mr. E. A. Dadabhay, A. C. Tilly and A. A. Cajee pleaded with him to take his seat again, as the House had the fullest confidence in him.

Dr. H. Dindar moved the fullest confidence of the House in Mr. A. H. Chotsia and asked that he be re-instated as secretary. Mr. Chothia took his seat again in reponse.

Mr. E. A. Saloojee condemned the holding of the meeting which he said was totally un-necessary and a waste of time for its members. He suggested that such petty differences must in future be settled by mutual discussion and officials should refrain from bringing such issues before a Board meeting He expressed the need for greater co-operation and caucus meetings of the officials.

The Meeting terminated at 4-55 with a mutual handshake of Mr. M. O. Moolka and A. H. Chothia.

MANZINI PROPERTY: Mr. Y. Wadee reported that the house had decided to rescind the lease of Mr. Diamond. The documents were sent to five different firms in Swaziland who would not act. Summons had now been served and pleadings were awaited. House decided to await closure of pleadings.

#### K.G.HOLDINGS :

Mr. A. Bhabha, the book-kepper, reported that the total rental from this property was R1302.80 p.m. but it appeared that the total collected by Mr. Friedland was about R1700. Certain discrepancy in rentals was revealed by his own investigation and certain tenants were in arrears. Details of assesment rates were

> R787.95 for year 1969 1970 R787.95 1971 R954.20 1972 R1329.20 1973. R1329.20

There was thus an increase of R375.00 in rates since we took possession of this property. In reply to a question by Dr. Dindar as to why rentals were not increased pro rata to the increase in rates, Mr. A. S. Dangor replied that the report submitted by Bhabha be thoroughly investigated and that new leases be drawn up and implemented immediately. A committee compri-

sing Dr. S. Dindar, Ahmed Bhabha, Y. Bhabha and A. S. Dangor was instructed to proceed to Swaziland as soon as convenient. This committee was gi ven full powers to increase rentals, review and/or appoint new collector, determine correct monthly rentals and generally do all that is expedient to protect the interests of the Madressa and to report back at the next meeting.

#### The House resolved

"THIS meeting of directors and shareholders of K. G. Holdings (Pty.) Ltd. hereby resolves that Messrs. S. Dindar, A. Bhabha, M. Y. Bhabha and A. S. Dangor, in their discretion are empowered to appoint a firm of auditors in Swaziland for the purpose of auditing the books of the company and to perform whatever acts that become necessary in order to comply with the requirements of the Companies Act applicable in Swaziland."

Moved by Mr. Y. A. Wadee, seconded by A. H. Kaka.

M. A. I. K. Swaziland Ltd. It was reported that the donation of R250 made by this company was disallowed by the Receiver of Revenue. This amount should in future be chanelled thru Minister of Education. The register of this company should be kept in Swaziland in future.

#### SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Mr. Y. Wadee reported that most applicants had complied with our requirements except Mr. Sarang of Cairo and Mr. Saloojee, who did not respond. Mr. Randera did not submit any application this year. Mr. Wadwalla deplored the practice of some students in making personal approaches to members outside the scholarship committee. Mr. A. H. Kaka suggested that the first grant be made by March each year and students should make direct approaches to our office only.

#### ZAKAAT FUND AT KHOLVAD

Mr. Saleem Tilly reported that no replies were received from Kholvad. Mr. A. H. Kaka wanted to know what steps were taken to provide immediate temporary relief. The Zakaat committee was instructed to meet during the day and send remittance to Kholvad immediately. Mr. A. S. Dangor said if Zakaat committee does not reach finality, then the whole idea be scrapped and Zakaat be distributed along properly organised lines.

#### LOAN TO MOOLLA

Mr. M. O. Moolla stated that the R3,000 advanced to him was repaid.

#### LUNCH ADJOURNMENT

The House rose at 1-10 p.m. for lunch until 2-15 p.m.

## RESUMPTION AFTER LUNCH at 2-20 p.m.

The Zakaat Committee met during the lunch adjournment and announced that an amount of £100 would be handed to a Zakaat committee comprising Mr. Nallabhai Khota (Convenor), . I. Saleh and Mahomed A. Moolla. An amount of £80 will be distributed and £20 would go towards the opening of a banking account. A detailed survey would be initiated in Kholvad and the committee's findings be tabled at Board's meeting. A list of recepients would also be requested.

### KHOLVAD AFFAIRS :

In terms of a mandate given by the Special meeting of 13th. May, instructions were sent to Kholvad to hand over the primary school to Government. A reply had been received that this was not possible since the new term had commenced and would have to continue through for anothet year. A further request was received that owing to increase in roll of pupils, a dire need for another classroom existed and about R2,000 was urgently required. Temporary classes were conducted in a room at Joe Patel Bangla. An amount of Rs. 11,050/- was required for benches and the buildings of toilets. Mr. A. H. Kaka donated an amount of Rs. 1,050/- received with thanks. It was decided that Mr. A. E. Khota would collect R1,500 from Mr.

Essop Bhaila, who was in possession of Flood Funds for despatch of R1,000 to Kholvad to be utilised towards the erection of toilets. The balance of R500 was to remain in trust. The following donations were gratefully received:-

The House instructed the auditors to have their accouns ready by the next meeting.

#### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The secretary read out the amended clauses of the Articles and these were confirmed by the House unanimously.

#### GENERAL

It was reported that Mr. E. Nanabhay had repaid R 300.00 as conscience money for favours received from the Madressa in past years. Gratefully acknowledged.

#### PAID SECRETARY FOR MADRESSA OFFICE

Dr. 5. Dindar stressed importance of employing paid officials to do all the extra volume of work entailed. Mr. A. S. Dangor fully supported the idea.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT officials are instructed and empowered to employ capable persons to perform duties for Madressa, at their sole discretion".

Moved by Dr. S. Dindar, seconded by Mr. E. I. Wadvalla.

#### CLUB PREMISES

Mr. A. E. Khota was appointed to take inventory of assets of Kholvad Club and to perform such acts and supervise the club premises as to maintain a high standard of cleanliness and proper maintenance.

#### ACCOMMODATION OF QUWALIS

The secretary reported that an amount of R182.00 was paid by the organiser for accommodation provided to visting Quwali artists. Mr. A. E. Khota complained that these artists had created a nuisance and arrived for sleeping at hours outside those normal for the Club rules.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT commercial groups requiring accommodation in Club premises be discouraged and if allowed, payment must be made".

Moved by Mr. E. I. Wadvalla, seconded by Mr. A. S. Dangor.

#### KHOLVAD HOUSE INSURANCE

Mr. E. I. Wadvalla queried that payment of R465.97 for insurance premium on Khokvad House for year 1972 and why 25% rebate was not allowed. Mr. G. H. Bhabha replied that as a result of representations he had made to Commercial Union, we were allowed 25% rebate as our organisation fell under charitable institutions. Premiums were increased and storm cover of 100% had to be taken. Mr. Bhabha asked why the previous insurer's agents had not allowed the applicable rebate. Mr. Wadvalla said that the insurance of Kholvad House MUST be taken out with a company which will give best cover at lowest premium. Mr. Bhabha was instructed to approach Commercial Union and obtain clarification of 25% rebate allowed to charitable institutions.

#### INVESTMENT AT PIETERARITZBURG

The secretaries reported that the property recently purchased in P. M. Burg at cost of about R100,000 had to be developed to make the acquisition payable. A broad outline of how funds could be raised by means of forming a syndicate and giving active participation to Kholvadians was fully discussed. Dr. M. S. Dendar warned the House that the Madressa should not involve itself in commercial ventures which have an element of risk. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay explained that it was a sadr reality that Kholvad House would be lost to us soon and we have to compensate for this loss. One had to look to the future and it was intended to allow participation to members of the Kholvadian community. Mr. A. S. Dangor further elaborated that forming a syndicate was very welcome and the Madressa's purchase of a property in P. M. Burg was a very sound investment venture. A lengthy debate ensued.

The House adjourned for Maghrib namaaz and continued after 20 minutes

Mr. S. Tilly stated that shares will be issued to Kholvadians and he did not foresee any snags or material loss for Madressa.

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT this meeting accepts the principle of syndication and a Committee is to be appointed by this Board which would be directed to go into the mechanics of syndication and submit its proposals to the Board within sixty (60) days. The Committee may, at its discretion, consult legal and company experts in its investigations".

Moved by A. M. Jassat, seconded by S. Dindar. Carried unanimously.

The committee to consist of Messrs. A. H. Kaka. A. S. Dangor. S. Dindar. Y. A. Wadee. M. S. Dendar. A. M. Jassat plus ex. officio.

#### IT WAS FURTHER RESOLVED

" THAT The Madressa take transfer of the P. M. Burg property in the name of an existing public company, viz. CIFAD LIMITED, and empowered Mr. E. A. Dadabhay and A. M. Jassat to negotiate the cost of sale of the company to the Madressa."

Moved by S. Dindar, seconded by Y. Bhabha.

#### CANADA FUNDS

Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that an amount of \$900 was owed to Mr. Saloo-jee in Canada. Mr. A. M. Jassat queried this amount and asked for a detailed breakdown of this figure. Further proof of handover of amounts to recepients had to be furnished by Mr. Saloojee. Mr. Dadabhay said that morally, the House was honour-bound to pay this amount and House decided to discharge this amount to Mr. Saloojee.

#### LETTER FROM MADRESSA ANJUMAN - UNITED KINGDOM

A letter was received from this organisation asking for loan of £2,000 for cost of property purchased by them in Britain. House felt that it could not assist in advancing this amount but suggested that private donors would assist if two collectors come over to South Africa for collections. As madressa also operated on an overdraft, the saving would be minimal.

#### AFRICAN BUREAU OF EDUCATION

A letter was received from thos orgianisation seeking donations in cash or kind. The House decided to donate the typewriter in use if our office.

THE MEETING TERMINATED at 7-45 p.m. with a vote of thanks from the Chair.

#### NOTICE OF MEETING

The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia, read an extract from the Notice of meeting which appeared in the "STAR" of the 1st. May 1973. He stated that circulars for the meeting had also been posted to various centres in the Transvaal.

#### KHOLVAD WATER WORKS

Mr. G. H. Bhabha read a Memorandum received from Kbolvad calling upon the Madressa to hand over the control of Water Works to the local Gam Panchat (Municipality). Other letters pertaining to the same subject were read, outlining details of water being supplied to the village of Kholvad. As the question of handing Over control was an important one, and involving major issues of a principal nature, the Board of Management decided at its last meeting to take a referendum and therefore, called this meeting.

A general discussion followed.

Mr. A. S. Dangor stated that we have always subsidised Water Works from our funds here. It was his contention that because we were a minority community in Kholvad, we will now have to pass on control to other communities ourside of our Madressa, and give local inhabitants of other castes a say in the affairs.

...../2 Y. Wadee

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Mr. Y. Wadee required clarification on two points, viz.,

- a). Details of Land donations given to Water Works,
- b). Does present Gam Panchat enjoy Government recognition?

Mr. G. H. Bhabha read names of donors and stated that the Gam panchat was recognised by the Indian Government.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay wholeheartedly supported Mr. A. Dangor and agreed that control and operation of Water Works be handed to Village Council, as the majority was always entitled to rule their own affairs. The Madressa should subsidize householders who faced financial difficulties.

Mr. Abbas Nanabhay favoured a postponement of the scheme.

Mr. Saleem Tilly said that the crux of the matter was that the local inhabitants now demanded representation on civic body on the grounds of increase in numbers. He said that a charge be levied on the supply of water.

Dr. M. S. Dendar agreed with the views expressed and said that the time was appropriate for handing over control.

At this stage, a resolution moved by Dr. H. Dindar calling for free water provision to householders in Kholvad was ruled out of order by the Chairman on the ground that the House did not have sufficient discussion on the subject.

Mr. A. S. Dangor again elaborated his reasons for handing over the control of the Water Works.

Dr. M. S. Dendar felt that essential basic civic amenities must be provided by municipalities, as it was their function and not ours.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay outlined the new Hindu regime and stated that it is absolutely essential that representation be given to local inhabitants, who have a right of say. We have to bow to Government pressure and allow representation.

Df. S. Y. Dindar moved that

"THE Water Works be handed over to the Gam Panchat at Kholvad as soon as it is expedient."

Seconded by Mr. A. S. Dangor.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha challenged the Chairman's ruling in allowing this resolution and disallowing a previous one. The Chairman ruled that his previous ruling stands.

Mr. Abbas Nanabhay moved an amendment to the effect

"THAT control of Water Works be NOT handed to Gam Panchat".

Seconded by Mr. M. I. Bhabha.

Mr. E. A. Saloojee elaborated on the resolution that civic amenities was the responsibility of all municipalities everywhere.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha supported the amendment and added that the Gam Panchat was not competent of conducting the affairs of Kholvad, as per past experience.

The motion was put to the vote and the House voted as follows :-

FOR AMENDMENT ---- 14 votes. 30 votes.

RESULT: The motion that control be handed to Gam Panchat was carried.

DR. S. Y. DINDAR moved a further amendment and IT WAS RESOLVED

"THAT in the event of a levy on Water supply be imposed, then the Madressa is directed to give financial assistance to those needy and deserving cases who merit support and pay for Water supply. Madressa will exercise its sole discretion in considering cases of merit ".

Seconded by Mr. A. S. Dangor. Adopted with 4 abstentions.

...../3. Mr. M.

Mr. M. Hoosen Ragie, a visitor from Leicester, United Kingdom, stated that the Kholvad Jamaat in Leicester had purchased a property for £3000, on which an amount of £2000 was owing on a mortgage bond. Interest at  $14\frac{1}{2}\%$  was payable and he requested a loan from the Madressa to pay off the bond.

Mr. A. S. Dangor replied that since the Madressa was itself in need of finance at the moment, circumstances were such as to prevent us from making a favourable grant. However, he was prepared to call on the community to come to the assistance of Mr. Ragie.

It was decoded that the Board of Management would take a decision on this matter at its next meeting.

#### GENERAL

The Chairman explained that the Madressa had purchased a property in Pietermaritzburg at a cost of R100,000 and it was the decision of the Investment Committee to make improvements on the site of about half a million rands. The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia gave details of the property and how it was intended to finance the scheme, and how the property could be developed by a joint effort in which members of the Madressa could participate and benefit financially by forming a syndicate.

#### IR WAS RESOLVED

"THAT the officials of the Investment Committee, namely Messrs. E. A. Dadabhay, A. H. Chothia and A. H. Kaka be hereby authorised to seek a loan of R55,000 from Standard Bank, Library Gardens Branch on our current account and to make such capital repayments as our financial position allowed. They are further instructed and empowered to sign any documents and pledge such securities as they deem necessary to give effect to this resolution and in obtaining the loan."

Moved by Mr. A. S. Dangor, and seconded by Dr. S. Y. Dindar. Passed without dissension.

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Gentlemen,

#### Assalamu- Alaikoom.

It is with pleasure that I present this report of my findings in Kholvad during my recent visit. At the outset I must thank all Committee Members and residents of Kholvad who were very cooperative and gave me all the information and assistance. I have brought with me accounts of the Madressa, high and primary schools, Electricity, Waterworks, Kinara and Tower Masjids. Accounts of all the above are very well kept and they are annually audited by registered accountants.

Gentlemen, I appeal that serious thought be given to many burning questions of Kholvad. I here below give you a brief summary of conditions in Kholvad and Inshallah during the course of discussions I will enlighten you in detail on all matters.

#### DINIVAAT MADRESSA.

The roll of the Madressa is as follows: 140 boys and 90 girls - Total 230. There are 6 Ustads who are qualified and who are in our employ for the last 21 months. The salary bill for the Madressa is Rupees 970.00 per month.

The classes commences at 7.45 a.m. and terminates at 10.15 a.m. The examinations are taken twice yearly by the Principal of our High School and Committee Members and the annual examinations are taken by Moulanas from heighbouring villages.

The progress of pupils in the Madressa is good and residents of Kholvad are happy with our Madressa. The Madressa is understaffed and requires 2 additional Ustads. The appearance of the building is very poor and toilet facilities are very bad (i.e. 1 each toilet for boys and girls).

I recommend that the board give immediate attention to erect additional toilets, increase Ustads, and repaint the building.

#### HIGH SCHOOL.

The high school functions extremely well. The results at examinations and at school competitions of our pupils is of a high standard. A number of trophies and shields are on display which were won by our pupils. The condition of the school building is very pathetic and it is an eyesore. Here also I recommend that the school be given a facelift. Gentlemen, I have to remind you that we do not incur in any expenses in salaries etc. for the running of the high school. The government grant plus fees balances the expenses.

#### PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The running of the Primary School has been a burning question. We have always debated and spent many hours thinking what should be done. Should we continue the school or ask the Government to take the responsibility? Here are a few facts and figures:

The cost of running the school is Rupees 42,000 for this year. The Government grant will be Rupees 12,000, leaving a deficit of Rupees 30,000. This amount we are supplementing owing to influx of more people to Kholvad every year this amount of deficit will increase yearly. Gentlemen, it is the duty of the Government to provide primary education in India. How long are we going to carry on? Let's be realistic and give this matter urgent priority. Friends, I strongly recommend that we come to a decision today and that the Primary School be handed over to the Government.

#### KINARA MASJID.

The Masjid is once more functioning smoothly. There was a problem of Imam and Baangi which was solved. The Mosque has shares to the value of + Rupees 43,000. National Savings Certificates Rupees 9,700, and additional shares of + Rupees 12,000. Total shares value Rupees 55,000. Approximately

18 acres of Land was donated to the Mosque which brought in yearly rental of Rupees 372. Gentlemen, there is an amount of R4,679-00 in our books for the Masjid. I wish to suggest that this amount be invested and the amount receivable in dividends or rentals be sent regularly. I'm sure with the above investments the Mosque will be easily maintained.

#### TOWER MASJID.

The Tower Masjid has sufficient income and is maintained well. The Mosque has shares to the value of Rupees 62,402. The income for the year is ± Rupees 6,492 (i.e. Dividends, Rentals, etc.). Here also we have an amount of R2,301-00 in our books. This amount should also be invested.

#### ELECTRICITY.

Nothing much to report as Grit took over control on 15.12.1972. An inventory was taken and our Committee will now be negotiating for payment. We should be hearing from them in due course.

#### WATER WORKS.

For the last 10 years the expenses incurred in supplying free water was borne by the Committee in Kholvad. As Grit took over the electricity our Committee in Kholvad now cannot maintain the expenses for the supply of free water.

The water works Committee rightly asked the residents of Kholvad a maintenance cost of 2 Rupees per house. To this there was opposition and a Naagrig Committee was formed. I had discussions with both Committees and residents. The majority of the people are quite happy to pay the maintenance cost.

Gentlemen, the waterworks is 4C years old. Very soon pipes will have to be replaced. The cost will be † Rupees 250,000. Who is going to bear this cost? We should all think very seriously and come to a unanimous decision today. I will give you my recommendations in the course of discussion on this subject.

#### ZAKAAT.

Our Committees and people are very happy if we could commence with distribution of Zakaak to people monthly by cheques. This would create harmony and avoid duplication. Time should not be wasted any longer and channelling of Zakaak through our body should start.immediately.

#### GENERAL.

I called a General Meeting of all Kholvadians on the 11th February at the High School Hall. An opportunity was given to all present to air their views and grievances. The Meeting was well attended and peaceful. No decisions were taken but there were a few suggestions, i.e. that each member be advised of his nomination personally, by letter. The people are quite happy with our nominations.

The opinion of the majority of the people present was that a maintenance charge be made for water and the Primary School be handed over to the Government.

Gentlemen, with these suggestions and remakrs, I now open the discussion on Kholvad and hope and pray that some final decisions be taken today.

May Allah guide us wisely in our decisions.

CLUB PREMISES: Mr. M. A. Nanabhay asked what stocks and inventories were taken of goods on club premises. Mr. A. E. Khota replied that stock was mot taken but that the place had improved in appearance. The House thanked Mr. Khota and instructed him to take an inventory soon.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT

: Mr. E. I. Wadvalla presented detailed report of Revenue and Expenditure account for the period ended June 1973.

The secretary explained that an amount of R51.02 shown as travelling expenses in the Swaşiland Account was for disbursements paid by him for petrol and accommodation paid for the delegation of four members who overstayed at the Holiday Inn. The visit to Swaziland was authorised by the Board at its February meeting and the expenses were met on Madressa's behalf. The Treasurer Mr. E. A. Dadabhay explained that when legitimate accounts were received for expenses incurred in the execution of work for Madressa, we were obliged to pay them.

#### STAND 58

The auditors reported that a lot of money was being spent on the lift and for plumbing repairs and electrical repairs. Discussions followed with arguments as to how to reduce wear and tear to lift. The Chairman reported that the feelings of the officials regarding use of lift by his Bantu clients was conveyed by the secretary to him but one

official had indicated to him "not to take any notice". Mr. A. E. Khota agreed with the secretary that Mr. Wadee's tenancy was discussed at official level and the secretary was delegated to approach the latter with plea to find alternative accommodation so as to retain the residential character of Kholvad House.

The highly complex question of paying interest to bank was discussed and Mr. M. A. Nanabhay suggested that separate accounts should be kept, in view of conflicting fatwas.

The House rose for lunch at 1-30 p.m., and remained adjourned until 2-30 p.m. when the meeting resumed.

Dr. H. Dindar and M. A. Nanabhay again raised the question of the Madressa paying interest and both stated that they cannot be parties to any act which is "Un-Islamic". The Treasurer replied that banking institutions relied on transactions based on receiving and giving interest.

P.M.BURG PROJECT

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay reported that although the committee has detailed the scheme, tentative plans have been drawn up, which shows cost of erection at about R550,000, yielding 8% for first three years and 10% thereafter. Sales of shares are being undertaken and the property has been transferred Estimates were given regarding building project. An to Cifad Ltd. amount of R5,000 in commission was due to the agent.

Mr. M. A. Nanabhay asked that minutes of the Investment Committee be made available to him. The Treasurer stated that the House should have confidence in its officials and the committee and the verbal report be accepted in the spirit in which it was presented. Mr. Nanabhay, at this stage, left the House after complaining that all his queries remain unanswered.

**GENERAL** 

The secretary reported that the new Articles of Association were registered and tables Certificate No. T4747, registered in terms of Section 11 15 65 dated 10/7/73. Mr. A. H. Kaka reported that Freedman and partners have volunteered to audit our books free of charge. The secretary was instructed to write a letter of appreciation.

The assistance of the assistant secretary was sought in announcing funeral notices to country members by the use of the phone. This request came from Dr. H. Dindar.

As there was no further business to transact, the meeting terminated at 3-40 p.m. with a vote of thanks from the Chairman to all members present.

COMMENCEMENT

The meeting commenced with a recital by A. H. Chothia from the Holy Quran and a special fateha in memory of the Late Mr. Mahomed Omarjee, assistant secretary and caretaker of Kholvad House.

An unopposed motion of condolence expressing sympathy to the family of Mr. Omarjee was adopted unanimously.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING:

The minutes of the previous were circularised to all members and Mr. M. A. Nanabhay queried the use of the words "unanimity in absence of notice to the contrary! The secretary explained that it meant exactly what it conveyed and stated that no-one had raised an objection to the date of the meeting when the notice of meeting was despatched. The House decided that the minutes were correct as written. Mr. Y. Bhabha moved a closure of the matter, supported by Mr. A. S. Dangor.

Another objection by Mr. Nanabhay regarding correctness of minutes regarding the P. M. Burg project was over-ruled by the majority of the members present and the Chairman gave his ruling accordingly.

Mr. Y. Bhabha moved confirmation of the minutes, seconded by Mr. E. I. Wadvalla. The minutes were adopted with the above correction.

#### MATTERS ARISING :

NOTICE OF MEE-TING 19/8/73

Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that the Chairman and other officials had agreed on 26th. August as being the date for a Board meeting. The secretary replied that due to the fact that this day was Shabe Meraj day, some members would have been absent due to fasting. No pressure was brought to bear upon him to arrange the meeting for 19th. August. Mr. A. S. Dangor said responsible members should clear the air and misunderstandings before making speeches which would could be a reflection on the integrity of members. After a lengthy debate, the Chairman closed the matter.

MANZINI PROPERTY

A letter was received from Mr. Y. A. Wadee stating that the pleadings were closed and that the matter would now be set down for hearing.

K. G. HOLDINGS

No account had been opened in Swaziland in view of the fact that no official had gone down to Swaziland. Mr. A. S. Dangor was requested to open an account at a bank there soon.

ZAKAAT ACCOUNT

Mr. S. Tilly reported that nothing had been done during the past few months. Mr. A. S. Dangor made a plea that the question of Zakaat distribution be disposed of immediately and Mr. Tilly was instructed to report back at the next meeting.

CLUB PREMISES

Mr. A. E. Khota prepared an inventory and this was tabled at the meeting. Mr. A. S. Dangor complimented Mr. Khota on his efforts to refurnish the Club premises and for other renovations and suggested that Club funds be utilised where-ever necessary.

REMISES

Mr. E. I. Wadvalla, in his capacity as auditor, queried the payment of R465.97 as premium on insurance of Khol-He stated that he was not certain whether the applicable 25% rebate had been passed on in respect also of the Swaziland property, nor on any other premises owned by the Madressa. Mr. G. H. Bhabha explained that our dealings in matters regarding insurance were only with Tariff Companies and saw no reason why our present agents, viz. Saley's Agencies (Pty.) Ltd. were not giving us the benefits accruing to registered welfare organisations, when other leading companies were enjoying similar concessions. As a result of his abbitious approach and efforts, the Madressa enjoyed certain facilities and queried why these facilities were not extended to include all our properties. Mr. A. S. Dangor was of the opinion that the "privileged" letter should not have been distributed and we should not concern ourselves with tariff and/or non-tariff companies. Mr. E. I. Wadvalla read a letter from Sąley's Agencies dated June advising acceptance of premium of R300 odd for insurance worth R250,000 on Kholvad House. The House decided that any Insurance company willing to give best and most favourable rate of premium be approached with a view to insu-Mr. A. M. Nanabhay wanted to ring Madressa's assets. know whether Mr. Bhabha had applied his mind to the issues involved. Mr. A. M. Jassat replied that all Madressa's properties enjoy 25% on all premiums, but Mr. G. H. Bhabha maintained that this was not allowed, partocularly on the Swaziland property.

STAND 58 -KHOLVAD HOUSE

A petition signed by many tenants of Kholvad House was tabled. The petition complained about the nuisance occasioned by undesirable elements coming to consult attorneys Wadee & Mia and also regarding loiterers which disturbed the peace and privacy of the tenants. The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia explained that a decision taken by the officials earlier in the year appealing to Wadee & Mia to seek other premises was conveyed by him to Mr. Y. Wadee, who was subsequently told by Mr. M. O. Moolla (correctly or otherwise) to ignore Mr. Chothia's plea. The verbal notice had thus no effect. The secretary was instructed to write to Dangor & Wadee requesting them to vacate the premises by the end of January 1974.

The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia further reported that a

summons had been served on him to answer a charge of dumping rubish in the yard at back of Khblvad House and a contravention of the Health By-Laws. The House resolved that since Mr. Y. A. Wadee and partner were responsible for creating this nuisance, they be held for any fines imposed by the court.

A letter offering R36,000 for the purchase of the above property was received from Tyre Centre (Pty.) Ltd. The House unanimously decided NOT to sell this property, as the offer was too low.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay moved that

"Officials of Madressa meet twice monthly to discuss relative matters."

Seconded by Dr. M. S. Dendar.

The secretary was also instructed to prepare the minutes within a fortnight of the meeting and members were informed that corrections to the minutes were to be submitted at least two weeks prior to the date of the Board meeting.

AUDITOR'S REPORT : Mr. A. S. Dangor moved that the report be accepted, seconded by Mr. S. Tilly.

## INCREASE OF RENTALS OF OFFICE PREMISES :

"THAT The House had the fullest confidence in its officials who are hereby empowered to approach  $M\mathbf{r}_{ullet}$  Diamond and resolve the dispute regarding the lease in a manner beneficial to the Madressa".

Seconded by Dr. M. S. Dendar.

#### (b). K. G. HOLDINGS

A banking account in the name of K. G. Holdings (Pty.) Ltd. has been opened at Barclays Bank, Manzini.

#### (c). ZAKAAT ACCOUNT

 $\operatorname{Mr.}$  S. Tilly reported that no progress had been made

and no collections had been undertaken. Mr. M. A. Nanabhay moved "THAT the Zakaat Funds standing to the credit of this Fund be remitted to Kholwad for distribution there to the needy by the Kholvad Madressa!

Seconded by Mr. M. A. Denath.

The Zakaat Committee was granted the discretion to peruse the list submitted and select names of recepients.

## (d). KHOLVAD HOUSE INSURANCE

Mr. A. S. Dangor re-iterated that consideration be given to giving insurance to any company, either tariff or non-tariff, but that the guiding factor should be the selection of a company which gave the Madressa best terms and most competitive rates.

## (e). STAND 58 - KHOLVAD HOUSE

Mr. Y. A. Wadee reported that he was in search of alternative accommodation which should be available to him in about eight weeks time. Mr. Wadee further explained that there were two causes for complaints by the Health Department, viz. one of dumping rubish and another for water flowing into Council sewers and street. The case against the Madressa had been withdrawn.

## (f). NEW PROCEDURES

The secretary reported that officials met at fairly frequent intervals to discuss various matters concerning the Madressa.

## (g). INCREASE OF RENTALS OF DFFICE PREMISES

The officials were again reminded that the rentals of office premises in Kholvad House be increased to the level granted by the Board. The officials were requested to report progress in this matter by the next meeting.

## (h). ROOM IN ROOF

The secretary reported that the room on the roof of Kholvad House had been renovated by a private person to whom it was mow let at R25.00 per month.

- POST OF CARETAKER: Mr. A. S. Dangor again stressed the importance of engaging the services of an appropriate full-time worker proficient in typing and general office work. This person would be in charge of giving effect to resolutions taken at meetings and other allied duties. Top priority must be given to this important matter to obtain services of competent person. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay supported this contention.
- MR. A. H. KAKA®s RESIGNATION: Mr. E. A. Dadabhay reported that Mr. Kaka had withdrawn his letter of resignation and the matter was closed.
- MR. MAKKI'S TENANCY : A copy of a letter addressed to Mr. Makki was read to the House by the secretary advising him that the flat was to be Gc-cupied by his sisier temporarily during 1974. Mr. A. E. Khota reported that he had noticed new furniture being installed in Makki's flat. The officials were instructed to investigate and report back.
- MR. A. H. BABU PATEL: The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia reported that he had collected six months rent at great danger to himself, but Mr. Patel had again fallen in arrears for another three months. Mr. A. S. Dangor, A. H. Chothia and Dr. M. S. Dendar suggested that whilst Mr. Babu Patel remained in difficulty, leniency should be extended to him and his family, but that compassion should remain within reasonable bounds.

The House adjourned at this stage for lunch until 2-30 p.m.

..../3 AUDITOR'S

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: Mr. G. H. Bhabha severely rebuked and criticised the absence of Mr. E. I. Wadvalla, who he understood, was participating in a cricket match. He stated that the auditors should take their assignment more seriously and attend to Kholvad matters before sport. Mr. A. H. Chothia supported Mr. Bhabha and stated that it made his task of compiling the Annual Report very difficult, since the reports have to be typed and bound and there was very little time left for this work. It was also regrettable that Mr. Ahmed Bhabha, the book-keeper, who was seen earlier in the Board room, had also left without leaving any accounts or re-The House also agreed that if the Chairman's report ports. was not received in good time, it would be omitted from the Annual Report of the Madressa and a separate annexure be insert-

KHOLVAD MATTERS

: Mr. M. A. Nanabhah enquired whether copies of resolutions taken at Emergency Meeting had been despatched to Kholvad. Mr. G. H. Bhabha replied that this had been done.

A letter dated 16/12/73 regarding handing of the Primary LATTER FROM KHOLVAD : School to Gujarat Government was received. The letter was dismissed on the grounds that it had been drafted by an anonymous person to whom the Madressa was not answerable.

LETTER OF A. H. KHORI : Appealing for funds to proceed to France. This letter was handed to Mr. A. E. Khota for his attention and assistance.

LETTER FROM NALLABHAI KHOTA: Dated 5 November 1973 stating that the condition of the Water pipes was deteriorating. It also stated that a Hafez class was started and had 23 pupils studying. It was made clear that Dr. A. Bhyat undertook to finance this undertaking and pay the salary of the teacher as well as pay for the maintemance of the students from outside Kholvad. It was learnt that Dr. Bhyat now wants the Madressa to pay maintenance costs, but limited to local children of Kholvad . Mr. G. H. Bhabha was instructed to contact Dr. Bhyat and clarify the position.

P. M. BURG PROJECT :

Mr. M. A. Nanabhay requested what progress had been made. Mr. G. H. Bhabha stated that he was not fully aware of the new company and asked for some pertinent details about Cifad Ltd. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay reported that Mr. A. M. Jassat was in charge and in his absence, could not throw any light on this matter. Mr. A. S. Dangor further explained that transfer of shares and resignation of previous directors, appointment of new directors had not taken place and Mr. Jassat would answer these questions. Selling of shares to members had been a slow process, and this aspect deserved serious thought and immediate attention. Mr. G. H. Bhabha wanted to know to whom commission was paid and Mr. Dadabhay replied that this was paid to some estate agent. A lengthy debate then ensued to determine why there had been such a delay. The House resolved to instruct Mr. Dadabhay and Jassat to effect immediate transfer of shares and bring all other legal company requirements up-to-date. Also undertaking are to be taken from all directors that the shares were only held as nominees and in trust.

GENERAL

Mr. Hamid Dangor enquired what amount had been collected on loan scholarships and asked for details. Mr. Wadee promised to provide these details in the Annual Report.

A. G. MEETING :

The House agreed to hold the annual general meeting on the 10th. February 1974 at the L. M. A. Hall at 10-00 a.m.

Mr. A. S. Dangor moved a motion exptessing appreciation and thanks of the House to the officials and sub-committees for the good work done during the year. Mr. M. A. Nanabhay explained that his motives in asking questions were honourable and he meany no harm to the secretary in whom he had the fullest con-The meeting terminated at 5-50 p.m. with thanks.

Mr. Y. Bhabha congratulated Mr. A. H. Chothia on his appointment as the new Radio contributor for Transvaal.

#### MINUTES OF THE 60th. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD IN THE L.M.A.

#### HALL. LENASIA ON SUNDAY, 10th. FEBRUARY 1974 at 11-30 A.M.

The meeting commenced at 11-30 a.m. with a Qirayat rendered by Hafez Ebrahim Areff, followed by a fateha offered by Mr. A. H. Chothia in memory of deceased members and their families and generally for all Muslims and peace on earth.

PRESENT :

Mr. M. O. Moolla, in the Chair.

Mr. A. H. A. Chothia,

Mr. G. H. A. Bhabha, Hon. Secretaries.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee, Vice-Chairman. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay, Hon. Treasurer.

191 Members of the Association.

The Chairman declared the meeting, welcomed all members present, and asked the secretary to read the Notice convening the meeting.

#### (a). MINUTES OF THE 59th. A. G. MEETING :

The Minutes were read by Mr. G. H. Bhabha and it was ordered that the following corrections be made:-

The word "MOSQUE" to read "FUND".

Dr. Kotwal prize money to read "R250 made available to Scholarship Committee to be used by them at their discretion".

Mr. A. S. Bhabha moved confirmation of the minutes as read, seconded by Mr. E. Pahad.

#### (b). MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM:

TEACH FUND: Mr. H. Dindar explained that the amount of R1500 was derived from accrued interest., and raised his objection to collection of interest.

Mr. M. Moolla asked how the Dr. Kotwal prize was advertised as many students were not aware of such a prize. Mr. A. S. Dangor replied that circulars were sent out to various centres.

Mr. M. A. Nanabhay asked why the Chairman's and Secretarial reports were not tabled at the last meeting of the Board. The secretary, Mr. A. H. Chothia explained that his secretarial report was ready but because the Chairman was away overseas, both reports had to be omitted. Mr. Y. A. Wadee supported Mr. Chothia in his explanation and added that both auditors were also absent and could not table their accounts and financial statements.

Mr. Aboo Cajee asked why the L. M. A. were not supported financially by the Madressa. Mr. A. H. Chothia replied that because no written request was made, the Madressa was not aware of L. M. A.'s needs and could not entertain any application in its absence.

It was also reported that Mr. Saleem Dadhi did not launch a cent—a—day scheme during the year.

Mr. A. S. Bhabha finally moved for the adoption of the Minutes, seconded by Mr. A. S. Patel.

#### (c). CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Mr. M. O. Moolla read his report.

#### (d). SECRETARIAL REPORT :

Mr. A. H. Chothia delivered the secretarial report dealing with all ...../2 aspects

aspects of the Association's activities during the year.

#### DISCUSSION :

Dr. S. Dindar took exception to the opening remark of the Chairman's report which stated that "no achievements have been made during the year". He asked whether the adoption of the new Articles of Association were not a major achievements.

Mr. G. H. (Babu) Saloojee stated that the Chairman had cast a bad reflection on the ability of all 23 members and asked whether the elected members were not dedicated men. He also asked whether all the officials cooperated or not and what was meant by "sad" year, as the report reflected bad impressions.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee, in a moving reply, said that not one iota had made the work of the officials inoperable and many achievements had been made during the year.

At this stage, the House adjourned for lunch until 2—15 p.m.

After the lunch adjourment, Mr. Wadee continued his defence of the work of the Board and refuted emphatically the Chairman's allegation that "no progress had been recorded" and there were many items of progress.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha made it clear that he had been in complete agreement with all officials.

Mr. G. H. Saloojee suggested that the entire report be rejected and he was supported by Mr. Saleem Saley, who returned to the meeting after an absence of 10 years. He stated that he was happy to be back and said that the Madressa was a charitable Institution and wes at a loss to understand why the Madressa should interest itself with "bulk buying and other commercial undertakings". Mr. Farouk Badat asked the Chairman to name the official with whom he could not co-operate, and the same request came from Mr. Iqbal Patel. Dr. A. Shyat said that achievements were the end results of the sacrifice of officials and the attack by the Chairman was unwarranted.

The Chairman ruled that the matter was closed and immediately there was an uproar in the House. Many objections to the ruling of the chairman could be heard and Mr. Farouk Badat insisted on knowing and having a reply to his question.

The Chairman Mr. M. O. Moolla yielded to the pressure and said that the disharmony related to his relationship with Mr. A. H. Chothia.

Mr. A. H. Chothia stated that he had prepared a lengthy indictment on the workings of the Madressa for the year which could throw all the lights on the subject of diminished harmony with the chairman. He said that it was felt by him that reading the prepared report would harm public interest and cause friction. He abstained from reading the report and the action was received by the meeting with warm applause. However, he did wish to make certain observations. The disunity had probably some origin in the fact that both he and the Chairman were travel agente and some rivalry was inevitable. But this rivalry was not introduced into the workings of the Madressa and he had not allowed this to cloud his sense of duty and judgment and of his commitments to the cause of the Mr. Chothia then referred to the achievements made by the Madressa during the year, stating that the highlight of the year was the adoption, after three years of preparation, of the Articles of Association and Memorandum and to bring the Madressa on a legal footing. All these were dealt with in His secretarial report and extended his hand of friendship to the chairman. The public appreciated this gesture and good spirit and of Mr. Chothia and applauded him encouragingly.

Continuing the discussion on the secretarial report, Mr. G. H. Saloojee suggested that the results of students be incorporated in the report in future. Noted.

Mr. Farouk Badat wanted details of his loan scholarship and said that if this information was forthcoming, he would be prepared to pay his debt.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee gave details of the dispute with Mr. Diamond and explained

...../3 that

that there did exist some grounds of settlement. Mr. A. S. Bhabha suggested that the matter be left to the new officials.

#### PIETERMARITZBURG PROJECT :

Mr. M. Moolla and Mr. A. K. Dinat asked what was the size, extent, cost and state of the land purchased by the Madressa in P. M. Burg. They also asked what amount had been paid for the purchase of the company Cifad Ltd. and the commission that was paid and to whom it was paid. They asked many other pertiment questions. Mr. A. S. Dangor gave an outline of the project, how the committee proposed to develop the scheme, and what difficulties were foreseen. Money for the purchase of the property was raised by means of an overdraft of R50,000. Mr. Dinat raised his objection to the payment of commission by the purchaser as it was accepted that the sellers generally paid commission.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay explained that all members should participate in the scheme and as a result the public will have a direct interest in the Madressa. Mr. Dadabhay explained that it was the aim of the Madressa to generate interest among members and should participate in the purchase of shares. Mr. Y. Moolla wanted to know how shares would be allocated and what prodedures would be followed. The Chairman replied that contact would be established.

#### CHANGE OF DATE OF A. G. MEETING :

It appeared that there was some justification in the change of date of our annual general meeting and there was good evidence from the record attendance that the change had been well received.

- Mr. A. C. Tilly suggested that we subsidise the Water Works to extent of £25 per month and do not give away control.
- Mr. A. S. Dangor replied that we could now rescind the resolution taken at a Special meeting of 13th. May 1973 whereat it was decided to hand over control to Gujarat Govt.
- Mr. Hoosen Bhaila related his experiences during his visit to Kholvad and emphasized that the people of Kholvad did not deserve any financial assistance from here.

Mr. M. A. Nanabhay commented that our aim was charity and for the conduct of a Madressa.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee stated that opinions on what procedure to follow may differ but it was not correct to rescind the previous resolution without giving Notice of Motion. After Mr. Chothia had again referred to the new articles of Association and read an extract therefrom, the matter was closed.

#### (f). GENERAL:

Mr. A. S. Bhabha moved "THAT the incoming officials be and are hereny authorised to operate a Banking Account in the name of the Madressa and sign all cheques, bills of exchange and other negotiable documents necessary for the operation and maintenance of the Account." — Seconded by Mr. A. C. Tilly.

Mr. A. M. Jassat moved a vote of thanks to officials and members who completed a full year of work and the splendid piece of work done during the year.

 ${\tt Mr.}$  A. K. Dinat supported  ${\tt Mr.}$  Jassat and thanked the officials for their devotion to duty.

After the reading of a Fateha by Mr. A. H. Chothia, the meeting terminated at 8-15~p.m. with a vote of thanks from the Chair.

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#### REPORT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE.

The Scholarship Committee met twice this year on the 13th of February and on the 2nd of March: The first meeting was convened in order to deal with the application of all those students who had previously been granted scholarships.

They were 29 application and all these applications were granted subject to normal conditions that these students provide proof of admission and enrolment at the Institution concerned. The total amount of grant made for and in respect of these students is R8171.00.

At the second meeting the applications of those she students who are applying for scholarship grants fro the first time were considered.

There were 21 applicants in this respect. 14 of these applicants were granted scholarships subject to the usual conditions of proof of admission, enrolment.

We had not received application forms duly completed from four of the applicants and we hve informed them accordingly. However we have not closed the door completely to their applications as we have considered possibilities that they lay not have received the application forms. One student was refused a grant as we considered that the particular applicant was a non-Kholvadin. One student was refused a grant on the ground that he was still a J.C. student and another was refused on the ground that a member of her family was already a recipient of a scholarship.

This breakdown does reveal that students are not confining themselves to a narrow and limited range of studies but are diversifying their interest. It is healthy and encouraging. We are hopeful and confident that in time to come this interest will spread to even wider field of study and pursuit.

The number of applicants increase yearly and so are the financial needs of each and every student. However our funds are limited and aware as we are, of the fact that the amounts granted by us can never really be adequate and meet the circumstances of the student, we cannot do but what is best in our circumstances.

The total amount of scholarship grant to new applicabts comes to R3896.00 giving us a grant total of R1267.00 in respect of all the grants that had been made for this year.

GUEST VISITOR :

The Chairman, welcomed all members present and remarked sharply on the late arrival of some members, especially the newly elected members of the Board. Mr. Y. Wadee also extended a warm welcome to Mr. Yunus Moolla, the secretary of the Kholvad Madressa from Kholvad, India, who was asked to occupy the chair of Mr. G. H. Bhabha, who was absent due to a funeral at Arnot.

Dr. M. S. Dendar objected to the minutes of the previous meeting which he said was adjourned.

MINUTES

: The secretary, Mr. A. H. Chothia, read the minutesof the previous meeting of the 20th. January 1974. Dr. Dendar stated that he did not say

" that compassion should remain within reasonable bounds".

However, Mr. A. S. Dangor and Saleem Dadhi guaranteed payment of all arrear rentals, whilst Mr. Babu Patel remained in difficulty.

Mr. A. S. Dangor moved that the minutes be confirmed as read, seconded by Mr. M. A. Nanabhai.

MATTERS

ARISING

: MANZINI PROPERTY: The Chairman reported that Diamond required R10,000 for the release of the lease and we had made an offer of R7,500, which was not acceptable to him. Mr. M. A. Nanabhai said that he had received a letter from correspondents enquiring what procedure to follow. Mr. A. M. Jassat objected to the buying back of the lease. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay felt that the Madressa should not proceed with the litigation

and he was supported by Mr. A. S. Dangor. The House decided to leave this matter as it was and resolved NOT to renew Mr. Diamond's lease at the end of its tenure.

INCREASE OF RENTALS OF OFFICE PREMISES: Mr. M. O. Moolla objected to increase of rentals of office premises in Kholvad House and wanted to know when such a decision was taken. The Secretary replied that a resolution to this effect was passed on the 4th. November 1973.

## POST OF CARETAKER

The Chairman reported that there did not exist that volume of work which justified the services of another caretaker and the officials were desirous of saving the Madressa the expense of having two paid office staff. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay added that the post must be filled by a person who could do all-round work, including plumbing and other caretaker duties and secretarial workincluding letter writing, correspondence and typing. Mr. A. S. Dangor said that he felt that the post of necessary and Mr. M. A. Nanabhai could be appointed. Mr. Nanabhai wanted to know why the decision had not been implemented and Mr. Dadabhay replied that this was not opportune. Mr. A. M. Jassat stated that preparations should be made now, as a lot of work would have to be done when the P.M. Burg project gets under way. Mr. Mr. Dangor had again stressed the importance of having a paid officaal, the Chairman promised that the matter will be discussed to the next executive meeting.

## AUDITOR'S REPORT

: The House decided that Mr. A. Bhabha was not answerable to this Board.

The minutes of the previous meeting were confirmed as correct and adopted on the motion of Mr. A. S. Dangor, seconded by Mr. Saleem Dadhi.

#### WELCOME TO

Y. MOOLLA

: At this stage, the Chairman, welcomed Mr. Yunus Moolla, who arrived in South Africa a few days earlier. In giving Mr. Moolla an introduction, the Chairman stated that Mr. Moolla had worked for the Madressa in Kholwad for many years and thanked him for his valuable services. Mr. Moolla is the secretary of KESCOR and the Madressa in Kholwad. Mr. Moolla gave a lengthy resume of the workings of the Madressa, Water Works and Electricity. He raised objections to the stoppage of funds from Johannesburg for the Water Works. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay corrected Mr. Moolla by saying that it

was not the wish of this Madressa to sever relations with Kholvad, but Providence had dictated that such changes come about. Mr. A. S. Dangor, in a moving delivery, talked about change times and the need for adapting to changed circumstances.

Mr. Y. Moolla pleaded for continuation of grants towards Water Works as was done in the past. Dr. M. S. Dendar explained that certain civic duties regarding edutation, primary and secondary schools and their upkeep, electricity and water supply were the responsibilities of the Government of India and this house was prepared to render assistance in every genuine case of need.

Mr. Saleem Dadhi assured Mr. Moolla of our support and the request for levying a charge for water supply was a request that emanated from Kholvad. Mr. M. A. Nanabhay wanted to know what was the monthly expenditure for supplying water in Kholvad and what were the advantages and disadvantages of handing over to Gam Panchat. Mr. Moolla detailed these . Mr. A. E. Khota further added that itwas due to the assistance from this Board that many students and other youths were settled in Canada. Mr. E. A. Saloojee wanted to know why this Board did not receive replies from Kholvad and why our instructions for handing over to Gam Panchat were not executed. Mr. Moolla replied that

- a). There was difficulty in interpreting our instructions to hand over. They write back to ask certain details and no reply was received by them.
- b). Loan of Rs. 40,000 to Madressa has not been repaid and Kholvad Madressa is constantly being pressed for details by Charity Commissioner.
- c). Cost of free Water supply was Rs. 1,000 per month.
- d). Gam Panchat was a poor institution and there was no difference if Kholvad Madressa charged or if the Gam Panchat did.
- e). Board must continue grant of Rs. 750 per month.
- f). An amount of Rs. 33,000 being proceeds of sale of property of Electricity Board was placed on fixed deposit. It is yielding Rs. 2,500 per annum.
- Dr. M. S. Dendar requested Mr. Y. Moolla to send detailed account of all our assets in Kholvad, their value and total income as well as details of all other buildings.
- Mr. E. A. Dadabhay asked Mr. Moolla what the consequences would be of handing over the primary School to Government. Mr. Moolla replied that he was opposed to this idea, because
- a). We would lose control of the school,
- b). We would have no say over its affairs,
- c). We would lose privilege of deciding when holidays would be held
- d). We would have no say over appointment of teachers,
- e). lose our culture and identity,
- f). We would lose our high standard of education.

 ${\tt Mr.}$  E. A. Dadabhay asked why  ${\tt Mr.}$  Bhuskav was not dismissed.

Mr. Y. Moolla replied that Mr. Bhuskav is a Government employee and may not be dismissed without valid reason. The Madressa wa paying him Rs. 50/- for various duties.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Moolla for his presence and indulgence and assued him our of our support when the need arose. It was reported that the High School building had a leaking roof which required urgent repairs.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT :

The auditor's report for the period 1st. October 1973 to 31st. December 1973.

The Chairman requested the auditors to show clearly the income and expenditure account separately for each stand, as was done in the past.

 $\operatorname{Mr.}$  A. S. Dangor moved for the adoption of the accounts, seconded by  $\operatorname{Mr.}$  Babu Pahad.

#### GENERAL :

LETTER OF MRS. R. OMARJEE, complaining about loss of black box from Club safe. Mr. A. Bhabha explained that he did Late Mr. Omarjee's income tax return and was aware of a black box in the safe. Mr. Bhabha asked Mr's Omarjee and his son-in-law Mehmood certain details. On Saturday morning, Mrs. Omarjee came and requested R100 which Mr. Bhabha gave from petty cash box. He took this to be the wages of Mr. Omarjee due to him for August 1973 and also gave Mrs. Omarjee a further sum of R90.38 a little later. On the day of Mr. Omarjee's death, no black box was found in the office, but this was found in the possession of Mrs. Omarjee's brother in Vrededorp. His I.D. Card and certain jewellery were also found therein. This fact was verified by Boetie Moolla. The House decided that the complainant be called officially and the whole matter be thrashed out in the presence of all interested parties.

#### SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT :

The report of the Scholarship Committee was tabled and showed that Total renewals amounted to R8171.00 for 1974/5 and New Grants totalled R3896.00. Dr. M.S. COMMENCEMENT : Hafex E. Areff recited a passage from the Holy Quraan.

Mr. A. H. Chothia offered duahs and special prayers on the death of Late A. S. Chothia of Arnot.

GUEST VISITOR

: The Chairman, welcomed all members present and remarked sharply on the late arrival of some members, especially the newly elected members of the Board. Mr. V. Wadee also ex tended a warm welcome to Mr. Yunus Moolla, the secretary of the Kholvad Madressa from Kholvad, India, who was asked to occupy the chair of Mr. G. H. Bhabha, who was absent due to a funeral at Arnot.

Dr. M. S. Dendar objected to the minutes of the previous meeting which he said was adjourned.

MINUTES

## AUDITOR!S

- c). Cost of free Water supply was Rs. 1,000 per month.
- d). Gam Panchat was a poor institution and there was no difference if Kholvad Madressa charged or if the Gam Panchat did.
- e). Board must continue grant of Rs. 750 per month.
- f). An amount of Rs. 33,000 being proceeds of sale of property of Electricity Board was placed on fixed deposit. It is yielding Rs. 2,500 per annum.

Dr. M. S. Dendar requested Mr. Y. Moolla to send detailed account of all our assets in Kholvad, their value and total income as well as details of all other buildings.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay asked Mr. Moolla what the consequences would be of handing over the primary School to Government. Mr. Moolla replied that he was opposed to this idea, because

- a). We would lose control of the school,
- b). We would have no say over its affairs,
- c). We would lose privilege of deciding when holidays would be held
- d). We would have no say over appointment of teachers,
- e). lose our culture and identity,
- f). We would lose our high standard of education.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay asked why Mr. Bhuskav was not dismissed.

..../4. Mr. Y. Moolla

Mr. Y. Moolla replied that Mr. Bhuskav is a Government employee and may not be dismissed without valid reason. The Madressa wa paying him Rs. 50/- for various duties.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Moolla for his presence and indulgence and assued him our of our support when the need arose. It was reported that the High School building had a leaking roof which required urgent repairs.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT :

The auditor's report for the period 1st. October 1973 to 31st. December 1973.

The Chairman requested the auditors to show clearly the income and expenditure account separately for each stand, as was done in the past.

#### GENERAL :

LETTER OF MRS. R. OMARJEE, complaining about loss of black box from Club safe. Mr. A. Bhabha explained that he did Late Mr. Omarjee's income tax return and was aware of a black box in the safe. Mr. Bhabha asked Mr\$ Omarjee and his son-in-law Mehmood certain details. On Saturday morning, Mrs. Omarjee came and requested R100 which Mr. Bhabha gave from petty cash box. He took this to be the wages of Mr. Omarjee due to him for August 1973 and also gave Mrs. Omarjee a further sum of R90.38 a little later. On the day of Mr. Omarjee's death, no black box was found in the office, but this was found in the possession of Mrs. Omarjee's brother in Vrededorp. His I.D. Card and certain jewellery were also found therein. This fact was verified by Boetie Moolla. The House decided that the complainant be called officially and the whole matter be thrashed out in the presence of all interested parties.

#### SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT :

The report of the Scholarship Committee was tabled and showed that Total renewals amounted to R8171.00 for 1974/5 and New Grants totalled R3896.00. Dr. M.S. Deddar complained that he could not attend for two weeks in succession. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay, in his capacity as treasurer, complained that sanction for overspending of R4,000 must be first obtained from the Board of Management. The House decided that a Budget should be presented at the last Committee meeting.

There was a balance of R188.52 owing to the Madressa. A general discussion for lowed in which it was pointed out that when the decision for an increase had been taken, Mr. Moolla was the Chairman of the association and past minutes did not indicate any objection on his part. Eventually, Mr. Moolla undertook to pay this amount, but "only under protest".

The secretary then raised the point of sub-letting by Mr. Moolla without the Madressa's knowledge and permission. Mr. E. A. Notices should be sent to each shareholder advising him of the position and comments should be sought for disposal of funds. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay advised that the funds received be frozen as at this date and a meeting will have to be called. The motion was moved by Mr. E. A. Dadabhay, seconded by Mr. A. H. Chothia.

PHOTO-COPY MACHINE: As it was felt that the rental of this machine was quite high and no use or insufficient use was made, the secretary was asked to approach the company (Rank Xerox") and release the Madressa of this burden.

#### AUDITOR'S

REPORT

: The secretary made some sharp comments regarding the auditing of Madressa's books by our honorary auditors and said that according to his findings, the books were not audited at all this year. The House called upon the two auditors to perform their duty and accordingly, the report tabled was NOT adopted. #### CORRECTION : AUDITOR'S REPORT :

It was pointed out that the books had been audited up to 31st. March 1974 only.

The minutes were confirmed as being a true reflection of what transpired at the last meeting and Mr. Babu Pahad moved for their adoption. This was seconded by Mr. A. C. Tilly.

#### CHANGE OF

#### **AGENDA**

By kind permission of the Chairman, the agenda was changed to enable the book-keeper to make comments and leave for another engagement.

The Auditor's Report was tabled and certain amendments and corrections were ordered. Mr. M. A. Nanabhai expressed his dis-satisfaction at the late presentation of accounts, as he was not prepared to ask details, since he had not studied these accounts in the short time in which they were presented. Mr. A. M. Jassat replied that this was not always possible, as many entries had to be made and only one and a half months had transpired. Mr. M. A. Nanabhai noted his protest at late rendering of the accounts.

Under Social Welfare, the following accounts had to be treated in proper books :

. The Scholarship Committee was requested to prepare letters

and despatch these to defaulting students owing the Madressa monies advanced for their education. Also, letters had to be sent to donors who had not paid the amounts pledged by them.

The interest rates had to be increased and the Loan accounts of the Madressa had to be adjusted.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS by Book-keeper:

The following recommendations were accepted :-

Care had to be exercised with regard to shares and loan accounts of the Madressa and Madressa had to be safeguarded.

Interest of R3291.36 should be charged to Cifad Ltd and the assessment rates paid on the stand had to be added to cost of property.

It was pointed out that the property was bought by the Madressa for its own interest and account and only later was assistance sought from members.

Value of the properties to be shown at market value and the auditors' professional advice had to be sought in this regard.

It was also noted that cheques in favour of students was posted very late and the scholarship committee was instructed to prepare list of outstanding amounts and other relevant details. The committee was also asked to decide on future policy and dates for remittance of funds.

MATTERS ARISING

ZAKAAT FUND : An amount of R1,400 equivalent to Rs. 27,500 was sent to Kholvad.

EMPIRE HOUSE: Babu Pahad reported that the property was in a bad state. The secretary replied that Dr. Dindar was instructed to inspect the property and sanction repairs and painting. The House had already sanctioned necessary repairs.

M. O. MOOLLA: The House was informed that no written authority was sought from Madressa regarding sub-letting of portion of offices occupied by him. Mr. Moolla undertook to write a letter to Madressa. Mr. M. A. Nanabhai said that it was not proper to sublet property and letter must be written.

A. H. (BABU) PATEL: The secretary Mr. A. H. Chothia reported that Mr. Babu Patel had agreed to vacate the Mint Road property in favour of himself as and from 31st. January 1975 at a rental to be agreed upon by the Madressa. The House confirmed this arrangement and accepted Mr. Patel's notice to terminate his tenancy in favour of Mr. Chothia from end of January next and authorised Mr. Chothia to obtain written agreement from Mr. Patel. It was pointed out that Mr. Patel was in arrears with his rent to the tune of R275 including November.

At this stage, the house adjourned for lunch at 1-00 p.m.

Upon resumption at 2-20 p.m., Mr. Bhabha explained policy regarding lettering of vacant houses, flats and property. The House decided that the officials are empowered to let properties at their discretion.

Mr. A. S. Dangor suggested that with regard to Stand 56, Burghers-

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dorp, tenancy of Babu Patel and the offices on the premises be treated as separate entities. It was suggested that the rental of the house should be R55.00 and for the office premises - R85.00 per month.

PAGEVIEW STANDHOLDERS Association was thanked for its efforts in obtaining higher valuation of leasehold properties. The municipal valuations of stands in Pageview had to be given at the next meeting.

PHOTOCOPY MACHINE: The secretary reportaed that this machine had been removed by Rank Xerox company and we were released from the terms of the contract. The final amount of R107 was paid to the company.

The Minutes were finally adopted upon motion of Mr. M. O. Moolla, saconded by Dr. A. Kaka.

#### PIETERMARITZ-BURG PROPERTY

: The Secretary A. H. Chothia reported events leading to the Architect's account of R4510.89. Mr. M. O. Moolla moved that this amount be discharged, seconded by Mr. E. A. Dadabhay. This amount was to be withdrawn from Cifad's savings account and sent to Mr. A. H. Dadabhay with instructions to compromise, if possible.

Mr. M. A. Nanabhai stated that it appeared that we were not geared for this huge projest. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay repliaed that financial atmosphere and inflation had changed the circumstances and cost of finance had soared. It would be unwise

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ignore the warnings sounded by leading financial wicards and to proceed with this scheme in its present form. With the sale of further shares, investment in other properties was possible, whilst retaining the present site. A general discussion followed. Mr. A. S. Dangor said we could not foresee immediate changes and the liquidity position was not quite clear. He felt that a meeting should be called of all shareholders where the position could be cleared. If was decided that a meeting of shareholders be called on the 8th. December 1974 at 10-30 a.m. in the Board Room.

: EMPIRE BUILDING : Dr. S. Y. Dindar, who arrived at the meeting late, reported that the staircase in the building was in a poor state. Waterproofing of roof was completed and felt that the cost of renovations would be nearly R5,000. Dr. Dindar had instructed Mr. Taylor to increase rentals proportionately with increase in water tariff.



#### (a). MINUTES OF THE 60th. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING:

Mr. M. A. Nanabhai asked why the reports were not received in advance of the meeting. The secretary explained that the delay was due to late receipt of the audited balance sheet and late arrival of the Chairman's report due to chairman's overseas visit.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee read the report which he had prepared in Mecca while he was on Haj. He expressed the sympathy of the House to all members of the community who had suffered heavy losses as a result of the heavy floods which ravaged Standerton two days ago.

#### (d). SECRETARIAL REPORT

Mr. A. H. Chothia delivered his report which covered several aspects of the Association's activities during the year.

By mutual arrangement, discussion was postponed until after lunch.

At this stage, the Chairman extended a warm welcome to Dr. H. Kotwal, who had travelled up from Cape Town specially to attend the meeting.

Or. Kotwal stated that he "was happy to be with his family" and suggested that a mission be sent to Kholvad. #### (g). GENERAL:

Mr. Y. A. Wadee gave a comprehensive report on his recent visit to Kholvad. Kholvad Madressa funds in Kholvad have been deposited with the Charity Commissioner. He found that the Committees were functioning satisfactorily and reports were made available to him. The Waterworks was functioning on a deficit of Rs. 4000/- per annum and they required our authority to impose fees on farms and water consumed for commercial use. The Charity commissioner also required a resolution from us duly authorising this imposition. In imposing a levy, the poor will be well catered for and would be subsidised.

It was decided that the Zakaat Committee will collect and remit funds to Kholvad. An appeal was directed to Mr. Cajeebhai of Reunion to co-operate with us and NOT to duplicate donations and to advise us when funds were sent.

Mr. G. H. Bhabha reported that Mozambique's new regime is encouraging immigration and we should endeavour to get young Kholvadians to settle there. Zakaat monies could be remitted to Kholvad by a responsible committee. The Madressa building in Kholvad had been painted at a cost of Rs. 18,000/- and this amount was donated by Mr. E. Kotwal.

Mr. A. C. Tilly gave recent reports received from Kholvad.

Mr. A. S. Dangor enquired from the Chairman whether it was necessary to re-inforce "oowara" in Kholvad. The Chairman replied that he personally felt that this was un-necessary. Mr. G. H. Bhabha added that no official approach had been made.

#### AUTHORITY TO OPERATE BANKING ACCOUNT :

#### IT WAS RESOLVED

THAT the incoming officials be and are hereby authorised to operate a Banking Account in the name of the Madressa and its affiliate bodies and to do all things/acts necessary for the proper administration of that account, to sign all cheques, bills and other negotiable instruments necessary for the operations and maintenance of that account."

Mr. G. H. Bhabha said that Moulana Samadbhai had reported that Mr. Essop Bhabha had collected some funds for some purpose and felt that this was not fulfilled. Sun 'n Sand were requested to channel their future donations through the Madressa.

The Chairman appealed to the House to assist the officials in determining what was to be done with the P.M. Burg project.

#### KHOLVAD AFFAIRS

Since the last Board of Management Meetings the Kholvad Affairs Committee had one meeting and three informal meetings to deal with day-to-day affairs.

Matters of urgency and of current interest.

Meeters discussed at these meetings are detailed below.

#### ZAKAAT FUND

As reported to the last meeting we have R18500 in bank for distribution. The Committee after deliberations decided to assist 43 Kholvadian families on the basis of R25 to Adults and R5-10 for each child per month. Total distributed in March amounted to R3010. The Committee decided to consider distributions to Non-Kholvadians as soon as more funds become available.

#### WATERWORKS.

In view of the information submitted by Messrs. Y.A. Wadee and M.O. Moolla that the village Panchyat was financially unable to take over and to manage and maintain the waterworks, it was decided by the Committee to recommend to the Board to recind the Resolution taken at the Special Gen. Meeting re-handing over the waterworks to the Pancyat.

It was further agreed to request the Board of Management to authorise the Waterworks to impose a Nominal Monthly Fee to be laid down in consultation with Head Office.

KESCOR.

According to Audited Accounts as at 31/3/74 the sum of R55,295 stand to the credit of Head Office. It was decided to request Kescor Committee to obtain Permission from the Charity Commissioner to repay the Loan to the Main Account.

The receipt of photo-copies of 4 fixed deposit certificates totalling R140,000 @  $7\frac{1}{2}$ % was noted.

It was decided to ask for clarification on why the Power House rent is paid into Kescor Account and not into Waterworks Account.

SCHOOL.

The School buildings have been satisfactorily re-painted at the cost of R15000 - and this Committee recommends that the amount be discharged from Head Office.

KINARA MASJID.

A lengthy letter from the Trustees was received seeking detailed information regarding its Assets in S. Africa. It was agreed that the requested information be furnished after the Board of Management had an opportunity to consider the request.

LOURENCO MARQUES-

-Following a-visit to bourenco Marques Mr. G.H. Bhabha wrote to Kholvad informing them of the possibility of the Migration of willing young men to Mozambique and asking for a list of Aspirants and Passports and other details. A total of 73 persons have applied. The requested details were received in unusually quick time, and two members of this Committee paid a short visit to L. Marques to ascertain the position, and have to report as follows:-

- (a) That number of Indian Immigrants have already arrived there since the coup.
- (b) Temporary Residence Permits are issued to holders of a Certificate of Good Conduct and Free of Criminal record from the Indian Police as well as having Mozambique endorsed on their Passports.
- (c) That only Skilled Workers can hope to secure employment. Unskilled Work not available.
- (d) Mr. Yusuf Cajee has offered to stand good for the Immigrants, and to furnish necessary Guarantees to the Local Authorities, as well as helping them to settle down.
- (e) That a first group of 5 or 6 qualified young men should be sponsored by the Madressa immediately and to follow this experiment with larger or smaller groups depending on our experience with the first batch.

KHOLVAD GYMKHANA.

Copy of Gymkhana's income and expenditure account for 73/74 together with a covering letter asking for funds standing to its credit in the Head Office's books to be remitted to Kholvad were duly discussed. Decision on this issue was referred to the Board Meeting.

#### A. H. (BABU PATEL :

The secretary reported that he had great difficulty in getting this tenant to pay the increased rental of R110 per month and stated further that Mr. Patel had failed to honour his undertaking that he would vacate the premises in favour of the secretary. The House resolved that action be taken against this tenant for failure to pay the increased rentals, even to the extent of taking the matter to the Rent Board.

### PAGEVIEW PROPERTIES :

The secretary reported that compensation was received from the City Council and the following cheques were tabled:-

The secretary asked for guidance from the house as to what should be done to the proceeds received from the Council, since it was maintained that Musjid funds were involved. It was decided that the funds be placed into the Madressa's current account and the officials were asked to negotiate for a further overdraft of R50,000.

Since the amount of R17,397,75 was already placed in Fixed deposit, Dr. M. S. Dendar raised his objection on the ground that the funds could have been better utilised on the purchase of sound investment of shares on a property portfolio in which O. K. Bazaars were the tenants. The secretary replied that the officials felt that they were hesitant in placing Madressa monies on risky share deals which were subject to constant fluctuations. The Investment committee was asked to meet and decide on possible investments.

At this stage, the proceedings were interrupted to give Dawood Saloojee an opportunity of addressing the meeting. Mr. Saloojee was thanked for the work he had done for the Madressa in its efforts to rehabilitate immigrants of Kholvad to Canada. Mr. Saloojee said that huge scope existed in Canada and stressed the importance of the Madressa in investing there. He undertook to collect monies due to the Madressa by the Kholvadians settled there, provided that accounts are furnished to him. He was thanked for his assistance.

#### PIETERMARITZBURG PROPERTY :

Mr. M. O. Moolla stated that at the last meeting, it was decided that we should proceed with the scheme. The chairman reminded that funds were not sufficient to embark on such a huge scheme. Mr. A. H. Kaka warned that if the plans were not submitted, the Demolition permit would be withdrawn. Mr. A. M. Jassat suggested that the scheme be trimmed down and was willing to take the committee to P. Burg this month. Mr. A. S. Dangor supported this idea and a <u>BUILDING COMMIT</u>-TEE was appointed comprising of

A. M. Jassat. A. H. Kaka. A. H. Chothia. A. H. Dadabhay (co-op).

The House decided that the present erections be demolished. All members supported the project.

DAN NAIDOO: Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that a Mr. Naidoo was owed the sum of Rl,000 for commission on the purchase of the property. The House decided that this amount be discharged and Mr. Jassat undertook to reach a settlement with Mr. Naidoo.

#### TENANCY OF M. H. ABDULLA :

A cheque tendered by this tenant for 12 months's rent was returned and the secretary was instructed not to accept rent after June from a tenant other than Mr. Abdulla in person.

The minutes were confirmed and adopted on the motion of Dr. S. Dindar seconded by Iqbal Patel.

#### CORRESPONDENCE :

(a). COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT : The secretary tabled a letter received from the Department of Community Development, dated 18th. January 1975. Mr. A. S. Dangor reported that we should try to obtain

this stand for future development.

#### (b). SHOPS IN KHOLVAD HOUSE :

The chairman reported that rents for the shops in Kholvad House was raised and the new rent for New Reef Wholesalers was determined at R450 per month from 1st. March. Mr. Salloo's rent was raised to R625 per month from 1st. March with a further increase of R50 on both tenabts from 1st. January 1976.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay suggested that complaints of sub-tenants be entertained by the Madressa and a fair basis for rent should be established.

Mæ. M . O. Moolla moved that shops in Kholvad House be separated and each shops be made direct tenants of the Madressa. The House agreed in principle to separate tenancy of each tenant.

The House adjourned for lunch at 1-15 p.m.

The House reconvened at 2-15 p.m. and the House unanimously decided that both shop owners be informed that it is the intention of the Madressa to exercise its right of ownership over the base-ments and determined the rent at 60% for the top shops and 40% for the shops in the basement with immediate effect. Further, no sub-divisions would be allowed to a party other than those who were in occupation as at this date. No new tenants would be allowed to occupy the shops without the written consent of the Madressa. Failure to comply would compel the Madressa to review the rentals and the tenancy.

Mr. M. O. Moolla was again requested to apply for permission to sublet portion of the offices he is occupying in Kholvad House.

#### KHOLVAD MATTERS :

Mr. A. H. Chothia apologised for the absence of his co-secretary who was ill and still weak after a recent heart ailment.

A detailed report was tabled and circularised.

Mr. A. S. Dangor complimented the new committee on its new format and hoped that these reports would continue. He recommended that the present position of water supply continue and the previous resolution to stand until fircumstances change.

Copy of fixed deposit at Kholvad was now received. The House decided that interest accruing on fixed deposit be utilised for painting the school buildings.

#### IMMIGRATION INTO MOZAMBIQUE :

Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that they had screened the various applications received and have recommended that five (5) applicants be subsidised for assistance for payment of airfares before 25th. June 1975. The House agreed to discharge the cost of air passage of these applicants.

#### KHOLVAD GYMKHANA :

It was resolved that a detailed statement be sent as well as remit instalments of proceeds of investments of R160.00

#### REPORT BY: KHOLVAD AFFAIRS COMMITTEE. 6TH JULY 1975.

In terms of the board's decision the following expenditures were authorised and the necessary money made available to our Madressa Committee in Kholvad.

Primary School Benches. Re 5000. 2 Sewing Machines. Re 4000. Electrical Equipment. Re 5000. Painting Dinyat Madressa. Re 8000 Re 22000.

NOTES: (A) The sewing class now has 7 machines.

- (B) The electrical equipment has been purchased.
- (C)The school benches have been purchased.
- (D) Painting work on the Dinyat Madressa is being completed.

PAINTING & FENCING.

HIGH SCHOOL The Kholvad office in its monthly letter dated 21st April draws our attention to the fact that the school building has been painted at a cost of Re 15,000 & that the painters and the suppliers are now pressing for payment and is appealing to us to remit money to settle these debits.

> Fencing of the compound will commence during summer vacation.

MONTHLY CONTRIBU-TIONS.

Kholvad office has regularly requested us to increase the monthly instalment by Re 500. to Re. 1000. to enable it to comfortably meet the additional increase in teacher's salaries ocassioned by the inflated cost of living and the urgent need to employ a qualified instructor for the Motor-Rewinding Course.

MONTESSORY CLASS.

In addition the Kholvad committee has in principle adopted a proposal to establish a montessory class, the operational cost of which is estimated to be Re. 7000 annually.

No clear indications are given as to the cost of furnishing the class. The old Mehfil building has been selected for the purpose. It is proposed that only pupils whose parents are prepared to pay Re 10. per month will be enroled.

This project will only be put into operation on the availability of funds from head office.

DINYAT MADRESSA. The annual imtehan took place on 6th April, 1975, of the 308 pupils 300 sat for the examination and the pass ratio was 70%.

According to the examiners, who came from Tadkeshwar the children were showing reasonable progress, but in their report they have pointed out certain shortcomings and weaknesses. They also recommend the employment of additional ustad for the Hifz Class.

Prizes in excess of Re. 1000, were distributed to successful pupils as well as those with 100% attendance record.

In support it is cited that many a time human life is endangered because of the lack of this facility and the risk involved in moving the patient to Surat.




BABU PATEL

Burg during May and had instructed the architects to trim the new plans. The sketches show twenty (20) shops with provision for extensions. The plans were on display in the Board room and a further report would be tabled. The House again gave the committee permission and authority to proceed with the building project.

placed and suggested that the Madressa do NOT support beyond 12 months, at the rate of R40.00 per person per month.

The suggestion was accepted by the House.

The Kholvad Committee was complimented on the manner in which the reports had been prepared and presented and the report was accepted.

Mr. E. A. Dadabhay reported that he had been informed that quite a number of private homes in Kholvad had been sold recently at nominal prices. With the number of Kholvadians (Muslims) still diminishing in Kholvad, it is time that the Madressa review its entire outlook and policy. He suggested a liquid reserve fund and new plans for thr future to be formulated immediately – with emphasis on strict budgeting.

Noted.

Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that Kescor had Rs. 55, 295.87. This amount had been credited to our Main Account in Kholvad.

GENBRAL

Mr. A. S. Dangor volunteered to collect funds as soon as plans of the P. M. Burg project had been finalised. Dr. S. Dendar also pledged his support for the scheme.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee was given permission to execute certain repairs to the floor of his offices at his own expense.

No final decision was taken regarding the cost of installing T. V. antennae to the various flats in Kholvad House.

#### MINUTES OF THE FOURTH MEETING OF THE 62nd. BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

HELD IN THE BOARD ROOM, KHOLVAD HOUSE, ON SUNDAY, 12TH. OCT. '75.

The Meeting commenced at 10-45 a.m. with a recital of a passage from the Holy Quran rendered by Mr. A. H. Chothia. This was followed by the delivery of Fateha in memory of all deceased Muslims and for goodwill and peace among Muslims the dorld over.

The Chairman, Mr. M. A. Saloojee, then welcomed all members present and thanked them for their peesence.

## MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING :

The following corrections were ordered :-

PAGE 2 under P. M. BURG PROJECT ;

.....20 "SHOPS" should read "SECTIONS".

Mr. A. S. Dangor moved that the Minutes, as circulated, are hereby confirmed as correct and are a true reflection of what transpored at the previous meeting. This motion was seconded by Mr. Baboo Pahad.

#### 2. MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM :

EMPIRE HOUSE : The secretary reported that certain repairs were not executed satisfactorily and will have to be re-done. The House decided to instrust Dr. S. Y. Dindar to take up the matter again with Mr. Taylor.

BABU PATEL TENANCY : The House decided to refer the matter to the Rent Board for its final decision.

M. O. MOOLLA TENANCY : The secretary reported that although a letter was received by our office from Mr. Moolla giving the Madressa notice of his intention to vacate the office which he occupies in Kholvad House by the end of October 1974, no official notification has been received regarding the sub-tenants who occupy this flat with him. The House decided to draw Mr. Moolla's attention to this unsatisfactory relationship.

FLAT 24: KHOLVAD HOUSE : Mr. Saleem Daree enquired how this flat was let and how many applications had been received. The Chairman replied that all the applications had been treated on their merits and the execu-

______/2 tive ....

tive Committee reached a unanimous decision to let the flat. He further assured Mr. Daree that the secretary had not used his influence in obtaining the flat for use by members of his family but that the decision was made strictly on pure merit. Mr. Saleem Daree based his arguments on hearsay evidence and the House dismissed his arguments. The Chairman emphasized that he was quite satisfied that the matter had been disposed of with justice and fairplay and with the interests of the Madressa in sight. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay supported this contention and said that the decision was absolutely fair and just.

Mr. Y. A. Wadee reported that he was informed that repairs to the floor tiles of his flat would be a very costly business and sought the assistance of the Madressa to compensate him with the cost of replacement. After the House had debated the matter, Mr. Wadee consented to have the repairs done at his own expense.

- 3. <u>AUDITOR'S REPORT</u>: The following matters arose out of the report tabled:
  - a). EMPIRE BUILDING poor painting and repairs.
  - b). M. A. I. K. (SWAZILAND) no assessment rates shown.
  - c). KHOLVAD HOLDINGS Wipe off entirely.

Mr. A. S. Dangor moved for the adoption of the report. seconded by Mr. Babu Pahad.

#### 4. KHOLVAD MATTERS :

Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that during Ramadaan, he was unable to prepare a comprehensive report. He suggested that the House accept the verbal report and would, at a later stage, prepare a written report which will be posted to all the members, during the next month.

Mr. A. S. Dangor raised certain points and wanted to know why the Kholvad Committee abroad had not speeded the visa applications. Mr. Jassat read a letter received from Mr. A. S. C. Khori complaining about the workings of the Kholvad Committee. Mr. Jassat tabled a new list of 49 Non-Whora residents who qualified for Zakaat assistance. The House decided to assign the duty of distribution to the local Kholvad Committee.

Mr. A. M. Jassat was asked by Mr. A. S. Dangor what attitude was adopted by the Committee regarding migrating emigration. Mr. Dangor stressed that it was his opinion that Mozambique does not appeal to him as a suitable land for re-settling and suggested that other avenues be explored by the Kholvad Committee. He further suggested that the Kholvad Committee be authorised to instruct that India committee to abandon Mozambique as venue for immigration. The House agreed to instruct the secretary to withdraw the air-tickets and invite new proposals. Mr. Saleem Daree was co-opted to the Kholvad Committee.

Mr. Jassat further reported that Rs. 53,974/12 was standing to the credit of account of Kholvad Electricity Supply Corp. and this amount could not be transferred to Main Account in accordance with existing laws of the Govt. of India. Mr. Jassat was instructed to write to Kholvad and dete mine how funds are to be used.

#### 5. PIETERMARITZBURG PROJECT :

Mr. A. H. Kaka reported that a cash outlay of RlO,000 was necessary for detailed drawings. The House decided to leave this matter to the Building Committee.

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General discussions followed regarding present trends and inflation and also possibility of selling the land. The House again consented to give the Committee its approval to proceed with the plans estimated to cost about R10,000. The secretary was instructed to write a letter to the architect confirming drawings of plans.

#### 6. GENERAL :

KHOLVAD HOUSE: The House gave its approval to the officials to have the following items attended to in the building:-

- a). Replacements of broken glasses., and repairs to roof.
- b). Approved steel staircase to be replaced.c). Painting of the building about R3,000.
- d). Installation of T. V. antennae cost about R1350.
- e). Installation of new switches and fuse trips.

POLICY ON FLATS: The House formulated a policy that flats which are at present let as offices will henceforth continue to remain as offices and their use will be governed by the use to which they have been out up to this date; in the case of flats used for private residence, future use will be the same as of now. Residential flats becoming vacant in the future will be used only and let as such only as residential flats.

#### PAGEVIEW STANDS :

The House resolved that un-economic stands in Pageview be sold to the Department of Community Development. Moved by Mr. Y. A. Wadee, seconded by Mr. A. H. Bhabha.

Mr. M. A. Behra was congratulated on his appointment to the Benoni Consultative Committee. Mr. A. H. Kaka was offered the congratulations of the House to his appointment on the Lichtenburg Consultative Committee.

The House also expressed, through its secretary, its appreciation to Mr. E. A. Dadabhay for his assistance in matters relating to the cleaning up and plumbing and electrical repairs to Kholvad House. He was also thanked for his assistance in allowing his incinerator to be used for the burning up of excess refuse.

The House resolved that the Annual General Meeting of the Madressa will be held in Lenasia on the 22nd. February 1976.

There being no further business, the House rose at 1-25 p.m. with a vote of thanks from the Chair.

The meeting commenced at 10.50 a.m. with a recital of a passage from the Holy Quran, followed by fateha offered by Mr. A. H. Chothia.

The Chairman paid a glowing tribute to the memory of the Late G. H. Shabha, who passed away in Mecca in early December. He paid tribute to the services rendered by the Late Mr. Shabha to the Madressa for over 30 years. Mr. A. H. Chothia and Mr. E. A. Dadabhay endorsed the remarks of the Chairman and regretted the great loss to the Madressa.

Mr. A. S. Dangor expressed the sorrow of the House in its moment of great loss and stated that he could not find words which adequately expressed the sense of loss of this great Kholvadian.

The House then unanimously RESOLVED

" THAT a vote of condolence and extreme sympathy be cobveyed to the bereaved family of the Late Mr. G. H. Bhabha and prayed for the eternal rest of his soul in the kingdom of Allah ".

MINUTES : The minutes of the previous meeting, having been circula-

ted to all the members, were tabled. The following cor-

rection was ordered :-

PAGE 3 : Mr. M. A. Behra was "ELECTED", not appointed.

Subject to the above correction, the minutes reflected a true situation of what had transpired at the last meeting. The minutes were confirmed on a motion moved by Mr. Y. A. Wadee, seconded by Mr. Babu Pahad.

#### MATTERS ARISING :

EMPIRE HOUSE : Mr. S. Y. Dindar reported that the defective win-

dows had been replaced at a cost of about R500.
The window frames would be varnished regularly.

MANZINI BUILDING: It was reported that the building was in a bad

state of maintenance and urgent attention was necessary. Mr. A. H. Bhabha was requested to inspect the property and instruct Mr. Taylor

to submit written quotations.

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Mr. E. I. Wadvalla brought to the notice of the House that this tenant was in arrears with his rent to the extent of three months. The officials were instructed to demand the immediate payment of all arrear rentals.

M. O. MODLLA:

BABU PATEL

Mr. M. O. Moolla reported that he would vacate his office by the end of February and wishes to make verbal application to sublet to two tenants, who were in fact his sub tenants now. Mr. E. A. Dadabhay appealed to Mr. Moolla to return the keys of the office to the officials and to ensure that his flat was empty when he vacates it at the end of February. Mr. Moolla agreed to hand over the keys of his flat in an empty state by the end of February.

KHOLVAD HOUSE:

The House resolved that the refuse charges levied by the City Council be passed on to the lessess of the shops and be incorporated in their rentals.

A. G. MEETING:

The House decided that meals would be provided at the annual general meeting on the 22nd. February by the Madressa. Mr. A. E. Khota was instructed to arrange catering facilities. Mr. M. M. Moola was asked to provide a microphone and loud-speaker systems.

P. M. BURG

PROJECT

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Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that plans were complete and would be submitted to the Council of P. M. Burg. Mr. Jassat suggested that only shops by built presently, with allowance made for future development. A general discussion followed and various views were expressed.

Eventually, the HOUSE RESOLVED

" THAT the scheme be proceed with slight variations and trimmed down to meet present conditions."

KHOLVAD

MATTERS

: The written report tabled was read by Mr. A. S. Dangor.

The HOUSE RESOLVED

"THAT a letter of thanks be written to Dinat Trust for the donation of 42 school benches".

"THAT Welfare grants be increased to R15,00 to meet the staggering inflation rate; R8,00 from Welfare Account, and R7,00 from Zakaat account."

"THAT the Madressa allowance at Kholvad be increased to R400,00 per month."

CANADA FUNDS : Mr. A. M. Jassat reported that an amount of R544,65 is still outstanding to the Madressa by Mr. Jojo Saloojee. The house agreed that this amount be demanded.

> Mr. Saleem Tilly reported that he had collected Rs. 6,500/for repairing the retaining wall in Kholvad. He also reported that during his recent visit to Kholvad, he found a spirit of friendship and loyalty. The residents of Kholvad were now co-operating well with our office and he pointed out that :-

- (a). KESKOR required authority to collect funds from the Charity commissioner.
- (b). Emigtation from Kholvad was being investigated.
- (c). The Zakaat Fund was being conducted in a responsible manner and recommended that ALL Muslims in Kholvad be supported from the Fund.
- (d). Only one Committee should be elected to administer all our affairs.
- (e). There were 133 adult Vohra in Kholvad; 72 eighteen year old and 129 under 18 years; totalling 334 who qualified for Zakaat.
- (f). Primary school grant used partly for High School and application for increase in grant has been made.
- (g). Extra Islamic education is provided to elderly girls in Kholvad at Rs. 100/- per month.
- (h). Bombay property's title deeds are required by Bombay Council from the Kholvad Committee to establish ownership. The Committee was instructed to write to Kholvan committee to denounce any intended Sale or disposal to anyone not authorised by the Committee.
- (i). Water Works will be conducted by Kholvad Committee who are seeking autonomy in this month.

GENERAL

The secretary reported that the Madressa was represented on the Islamic Council of South Africa and Mr. A. S. Dangor is the Madressa's representative on this body.

An application by the Lenasia Muslim Association asking the Madressa to sponsor salary of one teacher. The House decided to grant an amount of R250 and the secretary was instructed to write to the Association and seek information regarding other Institutions to whom a similar application has been directed and what response has been received from such other bodies.

After the Chairman had appealed to members to assist in the Annual General Meeting, the meeting terminated at 4-10 p.m. with a vote of thanks from the Chair.
